Thank you to those families that chose to take part in the Athena Dental visit. We had a large number of students that were seen by Dr. Miller! If you missed the dentist this time around, don't worry, Athena Dental will be returning in the spring and is currently scheduled for April 20-21, 2017, so mark your calendars and watch for forms to come home late March or early April.

**Attention Parents/Guardians of Kindergarteners!** Please continue to send in your child's required vision and dental exams for Kindergarten.

**Attention Parents/Guardians of 2<sup>nd</sup> graders!** Dental exams are required by the State of Illinois for all 2<sup>nd</sup> grade students. Please send in your forms as soon as your child is seen by his/her dentist.

\*\*Parents, if your child is seen by Dr. Miller, this **does** qualify for their required exam!\*\*



As the weather is changing, we are finding it chilly in the morning, but still having some pleasant afternoons. Please make sure your student is dressing appropriately, or at least dressing in layers, to accommodate these changes.



Remind your student to eat a **nutritious** breakfast prior to school. Breakfast helps maintain blood sugar levels, leading to better concentration, better weight management, and better long term health. Skipping breakfast may reduce ability to focus in class and cause less energy, reducing their level of physical activity.

Although the Centers for Disease Control sites *peak* flu season as December through March, it can hit as early as November and last until May. Continue to encourage your student to cover their cough (using their elbow), and wash their hands with soap and water to help control the spread of germs. A proper diet and adequate sleep can help boost your immune system, which may help to ward off the common cold and the flu. 

## **CHURCHILL ELEMENTARY SCHOOL**

### **Student Drop-Off/Pick-up Procedures**

- Elementary School begins promptly at 8:45 AM with buses dropping students off by 8:30 AM each morning. All District 308 elementary schools will be open at 8:15 AM for parents who need to drop-off their children early. **Grades 1-5 students will be in attendance from 8:45 AM - 3:35 PM.** Kindergarten students will be in attendance from 8:45 AM – 11:20 AM. The door to the left of the main entrance, Door #12, will open at 8:15 AM for those students who will be arriving to school early. Parents will need to park in a designated parking space in the front of the building and walk their child(ren) to Door #12. We will then follow our normal arrival procedures beginning at 8:30 AM.
- Beginning at 8:30 AM, car riders and walkers enter the building through Door # 2, located on the west side of the building.
- Enter the school drive on Jessamine Drive, stopping at the crosswalk to safely allow parents and children to cross. Follow Jessamine around in front of Plank Jr. High and pull up behind the car in front of you.
- Wait until Churchill staff directs vehicles to pull up along the curb. Drop off only at the front curbside. Please time your morning arrival to accommodate our safety rules, and to have your child in school on time.
- When exiting Churchill by car, you will only be allowed to go straight onto Jessamine or turn left onto Secretariat. You will not be able to turn right onto Secretariat.
- Parents who wish to park in the lot and walk their children to the entrance may do so. Please use the cross walk only and never allow your child to walk across the lot unescorted.
- Students who ride the bus will exit the bus on the east side of the building and enter through Door #4. Students may not be dropped off or picked up by car in the bus area located at the back of the building.
- At dismissal time, cars will line up at the curb as in the morning. Have your child enter on the passenger side of your vehicle. Only pull out of line when the person directing traffic signals you to do so.
- If you park your car in the lot at dismissal time, please walk to Door # 10, on the playground side of the school building, to meet your child. Students are NOT permitted to walk themselves to your car. Use the designated crosswalk to return to your vehicle in the parking lot.
- **Please remember that Illinois state law prohibits the use of cell phones while driving in a school zone.**

*First grade: Kool-Aid singles; instant oatmeal packets; popcorn balls/caramel corn*  
*Second grade: Summer sausage, beef sticks or pepperoni sticks (6-12 oz. size); cans of tuna, chicken or salmon; granola bars*  
*Third grade: Slim Jims or beef jerky; batteries (AA or AAA); protein bars*  
*Fourth grade: Cookies (small individual packs), coffee (singles-2 lb. bags or cans); hearty canned soups, ravioli, or stew*  
*Fifth grade: Full-size chocolate bars or Kisses; trail mix, nuts (individual sizes); men's socks (white/black; work/crew)*  
*Other requested items: First-class stamps; AT&T 120-minute phone cards*



## Notes from the Music Room...

Well, we're finally starting to see some beautiful fall colors, and the weather is getting a little colder and windier. November will be a very busy month here in the music room.

Our big news for the month of November is our Veterans Day Celebration and Fifth Grade Musical. On Friday, November 11<sup>th</sup>, we will be hosting quite a few Veterans for an activity with their Churchill student at 9:00 a.m. and a musical presentation by our fifth grade students for the Veterans and our student body at 9:30 a.m. There will also be an evening performance the previous evening, **Thursday, November 10<sup>th</sup>, at 7:00 p.m.** for family members and friends. The fifth graders are doing a phenomenal job—you won't want to miss it! **RSVP's for veterans to attend and hearts for students to decorate for any Veterans that they know will be accepted until Wednesday, November 2<sup>nd</sup>.** If you have misplaced the forms, they are available in this newsletter, in the main office, or for download on the Churchill Elementary website.

During the first week of November, all grade levels will be learning to sing "The Star-Spangled Banner" so that they can join in during the Veterans Day program. We will also be singing some Thanksgiving songs to highlight thankfulness at the end of the month. Other units will be as follows:

**First grade:** Musical Opposites—Students will learn to differentiate between loud/soft and fast/slow sounds and music.

**Second grade:** Instrument Families of the Orchestra—Students will be learning to aurally recognize the tone color of the four families of instruments.

**Third grade:** Musical Symbols—Students will become familiar with basic musical symbols that are important to reading music.

**Fourth grade:** Rhythm composition and dictation and Note Reading—Students are finishing up their rhythm unit by creating their own rhythms and writing them in measures on the staff as well as writing down rhythms that are performed for them. We will also be reviewing the notes on the treble staff in preparation for writing our own simple melodic compositions and beginning to play recorders in January.

**Fifth grade:** Students will perform their musical on Thursday, November 10<sup>th</sup> and Friday, November 11<sup>th</sup>. The next week, they will watch a video recording of the musical and write an evaluative reflection on their performance and participation. The last week of the month into the beginning of December, we will finish and assess a unit that we started at the beginning of the year on "Songs of the American Railroad".

I will be available for Parent/Teacher Conferences on October 28<sup>th</sup> and 31<sup>st</sup>, as well as November 3<sup>rd</sup> for anyone wishing to discuss their child's progress. Please call to schedule an appointment during the following times:

## From the Art Room...

**1<sup>st</sup> grade:** Coming up in November, first grade students will be learning about how the primary colors create all the other colors on the color wheel. First grade students will be practicing their painting techniques when they create their primary and secondary color family fish. For this project, first grade will also be learning how to mix the secondary colors using primary color paints.

**2<sup>nd</sup> grade:** Second grade students will be learning about the famous artist Gustav Klimt, and his beautiful shimmery gold paintings. Students will be creating their own gold shimmery paintings inspired by one of Klimt's most famous paintings, The Tree Of Life. Second graders will be creating their own tree of life paintings with gold paint, and filling their trees with different patterns and symbols just like Klimt's artwork.

**3<sup>rd</sup> grade:** Third grade students will be learning about the color wheel and the many color families that are created by the grouping of certain colors. They will be creating bright colorful artwork inspired by the color groups found on the color wheel.

**4<sup>th</sup> grade:** Fourth grade students will be focusing on the famous artworks of abstract painter Sonia Delaunay. Taking inspiration from Delaunay's abstract designs, students used geometric shapes and lines to be the dominate design elements in their own art pieces. Fourth graders will also be learning how to mix paints to create various tints and shades to add in their abstract paintings.

**5<sup>th</sup> grade:** Fifth grade students will be preparing for their Veterans Day musical. In honor of Veterans Day, students will be creating red, white, and blue designs for the hallway to go along with the musical.


