The 2016-2017 yearbook is currently being printed, and we anticipate passing the books out on Monday, May 22nd. As in year's past, every fifth grader will receive a yearbook as a gift from Home & School. Extra yearbooks will be sold on a first-come, first-serve basis on Tuesday, May 23rd from 8:00 am – 8:45 am. Yearbooks are \$30. Cash or checks made out to Home & School will be accepted.

A very special congratulations to our yearbook cover design artists. Maggie McBrayer, Alexander Lass, Emily Keys, Carter Davis, and Joshua Werner have artwork that is featured on the back cover of the yearbook and Nathan Keys is the front cover artist. Congratulations, students, on a job well done!

This year's book has a little technology incorporated into the pages in the form of QR codes. QR stands for "quick response" and when scanned with a smart phone or other device will transport you to a website where you will be able to view a movie. The QR codes will also have a website listed beneath them that can be typed into any web browser. The 2016-2017 yearbook will have two QR codes; one for the fifth graders that will highlight their year and the Fifth Grade Celebration, and another code for all of the events that have happened after the yearbook was submitted to the printer, like Grandparent's Day, Field Day, and the Award Ceremony. The best part about incorporating this feature is that Balfour maintains these movies for 30 years, so our children can one day sit with their family to look at pictures and videos from 2016-2017. The QR codes and videos will be active by June 10, 2017. I hope that you and your children enjoy this awesome feature.

Notes from the Music Room...

We are going to be very busy in the music room this month finishing up all of our units for the year.

The District Choral Festival at OEHS will be held on Wednesday, May 10th at 7:00 p.m. We have 49 students in our Honor Choir that will be performing that evening. We will be joining the Honor Choirs from 5 other elementary schools, as well as groups from Plank, Murphy and Bednarcik Jr. High Schools and OEHS. You are all invited to a great evening of music in the main gym at OEHS!

Here's what's in store for music classes for the remainder of the month of May:

First grade: High/Low sounds and Note Reading—We are just starting a unit on high and low sounds and the basics of notes on the treble staff (high notes are higher on the staff and low notes are low on the staff; we will also learn the notes middle C through G). We will do some activities with playing Boomwhackers.

Second grade: Note reading and Composing—The second graders have been practicing playing songs on the xylophones and glockenspiels by reading the notes on the staff. Before the end of the year, they will be composing a short song of their own and playing it on the xylophone for the class.

Third grade: Note reading and Composing—The third grade students are doing the same thing as the 2nd graders but at a more difficult level.

Fourth grade: Composing—The fourth graders have been working on composing a 6-measure song using 3 notes and simple rhythms to become familiar with the conventions of writing music on the staff. The first week of May, they will be performing their compositions on their recorder for their class. After that, they will compose a longer piece using any notes and rhythms they have learned with the goal of performing it before the end of the school year.

Fifth grade: Composing—The fifth graders have been working on playing melodies on the xylophones and glockenspiels to prepare for our composition unit. The first week of May, they will begin composing a piece using any notes and rhythms they have learned with the goal of performing it before the end of the school year. They will also have to write an artist's statement how the composition expresses their ideas.

Thank you all for your support of our music program here at Churchill this year!

From the Art Room...



Time flies when you are having fun! The 2016-2017 school year was a busy, exciting, and fun time in the Churchill Art Room. Students learned about new drawing, painting, sculpting, and many other art creation techniques, as well as learning about many new artists, art styles, and cultures from around the world. In the art room we also discussed many topics related to different school subjects like science, math, and history. Students discovered that art can be found anywhere and no matter what level of artistic skill you may have, everyone can use their creativity to create something amazing!

1st Grade students are celebrating the arrival of spring time weather and the return of spring wildlife in their creations in the art room. Students are creating spring art inspired by the return of many bird families, creating baby birds in nests paintings.

2nd Grade students created colorful pattern owls at night. After learning about the many unique qualities of these wise birds of prey, students put a twist on a night owl drawing through the use of black paper and bright oil pastels. Students created eye catching drawings of colorful and pattern filled night owls.

3rd grade students are learning about many different types of architecture. Students created castle landscapes, focusing on the unique structural details found exclusively on castles of the middle ages. The students then created their very own castle design, focusing on architecture details and adding details found in the medieval times to their artworks.

4th grade students are expanding their art making skills and creativity through printmaking. Students are learning the step by step process of creating printing plates using Styrofoam and how to print their images multiple times on their final art piece. 4th grade students will be creating their very own cityscape skyline scenes that will be printed on colorful watercolor painted paper.

5th grade students are learning about the history and art of printmaking. Students first created fish theme designs on paper and transferred their images the Styrofoam printing plate. Students will then learn the process of creating multiple prints using their one printing plate, being able to have more than one final piece of art.
