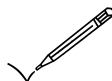

Thank you for a successful start to the school year! Learning is alive at Churchill! The students have settled into their new classrooms and are engaged in their learning on a daily basis. Some questions you might want to ask your child(ren) each night are:

- What are you writing about in school?
- How do you show Respect to your classmates and the adults at Churchill? What is the Golden Rule?
- What did you read or was read to you in school today? What did you like about the story?
- What did you learn about in Math today? Did you understand it?

During the month of October, we celebrate the Character Counts! pillar of Respect. We remind students to demonstrate the Golden Rule, Treat Others the Way You Want to be Treated, on a daily basis. Remind your child(ren) to wear Character Counts! clothing or the color **yellow** on Wednesdays during the month of October to show Respect. All parents are invited to our Character Counts! Assemblies again this school year. We are once again excited to have our Character Crew involved in the assemblies. The next assembly is scheduled for **Thursday, November 3rd at 9:00 AM**. We are also looking forward to the many learning experiences that will take place and dress up days during Character Counts! Week, October 17th-21st. Be on the lookout for more details.

CHARACTER COUNTS!™

CHARACTER COUNTS! Every day at Churchill School!!

Get ready for another phenomenal year here at Churchill Elementary School! We are so excited to see our students continuing to show the six pillars of CHARACTER COUNTS!: Trustworthiness, Respect, Responsibility, Fairness, Caring and Citizenship. During the school year, we will be focusing on a different pillar each month.

This year we will be celebrating the pillars with four quarterly assemblies focused on multiple pillars of character, and students will be receiving Character Counts! lessons in various classrooms each month. The Character Counts! Assembly for this quarter is highlighting the pillars of Respect (October) and Caring (November).

The month of October will highlight the pillar of **RESPECT**. The CHARACTER COUNTS! program teaches us that respectful people display the following behaviors:

- They treat others with respect
- They follow the Golden Rule (Treat others the way you want to be treated)
- They are tolerant of differences and consider people's feelings
- They use good manners, not bad language
- They don't threaten, hit or hurt anyone
- They deal peacefully with anger and disagreements

We would also love for you to help us by reinforcing the pillars of good character at home through using the language of CHARACTER COUNTS! and providing positive reinforcement when you notice your child displaying good character. The Churchill Behavior Expectations Handbook has a "Character at Home" chart in the back that you can use as a reference if you are unfamiliar with the language. Also, students can show their CHARACTER COUNTS! support by wearing yellow each Wednesday for the month of October.

Nurse's Notes

Welcome Back, Mustangs! I hope everyone enjoyed their summer and is ready for another exciting school year! To start the year, I would like to remind you of very important dates for the calendar, regarding required paperwork.

- **Physicals:** All students entering **Kindergarten** are required by the state of Illinois to have an updated physical, with a complete, and up to date, immunization record. Exams must be dated after August 17, 2015. Please make sure the Health History portion is completed and signed as well. This paperwork must be received by Friday, October 14, 2016.

Exclusion date is Saturday, October 15, 2016!

- **Vision:** All students entering **Kindergarten** are required to have an eye exam by Saturday, October 15, 2016, and must be dated after August 17, 2015. Forms must be completed, signed by an optometrist or ophthalmologist, and returned to school.
- **Dental:** All students entering **Kindergarten & 2nd grade** are required to have a dental exam by Monday, May 15, 2017. Exam must be dated after Monday, November 15, 2015. Please return dental forms to school, when complete.

Please contact Nurse Kim if you have any questions regarding required or missing paperwork. For convenience, your dentist or physician may fax/email missing paperwork directly to me.

"Back to School" for kids, has a much different meaning than for parents! Sharing is sharing when it comes to kids, but parents know this means germs, communicable diseases, & lice, too! Please remind your child about healthy habits like washing hands, sneezing/coughing in elbows, and NOT sharing combs, brushes, hairbands, hats, etc.

Regularly checking your student for lice, helps prevent outbreaks. Here are some helpful tips:

- Be alert to red bite marks or sores on the scalp, behind the ears or on the neck.
- Be alert to excessive scratching of the scalp.
- Check your child's hair and scalp regularly.
- Do not allow your child to use other children's combs, brushes or hair accessories or hats.
- Inform the building nurse if your child has lice.
- Hats, combs, brushes, hair accessories, all linens including pillows, and fabric furniture in the home or automobile should be cleaned thoroughly. Launder all clothing worn in the last 48 hours by the infected person.
- Treat your family with a medicated shampoo if you find head lice. After the shampoo, you can remove dead nits (eggs) with a special fine tooth comb or with your fingernails by sliding them off the hair shaft. Most products require a repeat treatment in 7-10 days. Repeated infestations may require a physician's prescription.

Please be aware that mosquitos are out in full force! I have had many students missing valuable class time, seeking relief for "itchy" mosquito bites. Remember to apply mosquito repellent if you are going outside. Mosquitos dehydrate quickly and therefore avoid the heat of the sun. They are most active at dusk when temperatures cool and the sun starts to set.

- If your child sustains mosquito bites, you may want to treat them prior to school, increasing their comfort, and minimizing lost classroom time. Please reinforce scratching will only intensify the itching. Even simple scratching, can cause small openings in the skin, introducing bacteria which may lead infection.

DON'T FORGET....If your student has a medical condition that may require emergency medication to be administered, please make sure you have provided the school with the following:

- The medication(s)
- Medication Authorization Form(s) – 1 per medication
- Emergency Action Plan(s)

****If your student's allergies have changed and no longer require emergency medications or plans, please notify the school so our records may be updated.**

Athena Dental is returning to Churchill on Monday, October 17th! A 2-sided form was sent home last week. If you wish to have your student see the dentist, please complete **both** sides, **sign** and return the form as soon as possible.

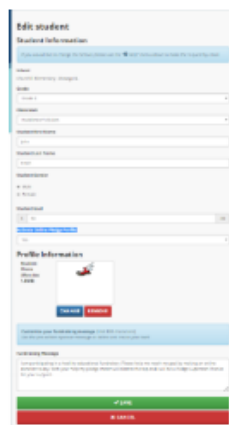

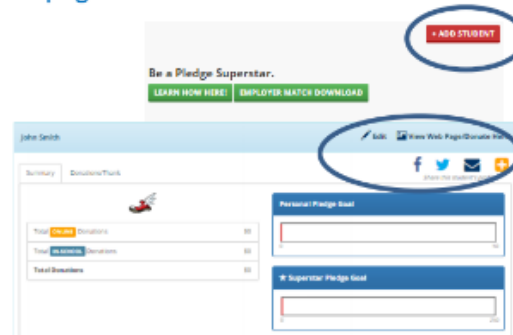

Notes from the Music Room. . .

The school year is off to a great start—I can't believe that October is here already! It actually felt pretty chilly this morning! I always look forward to the cool, crisp fall weather!

The students in 1st – 4th grades have been having lots of fun learning to keep the steady beat during the month of September by playing instruments, creating hand jives, playing movement games, and singing many fun songs. The 5th grade students have been working on a unit on Songs of the American Railroad.

During the month of October, the first graders will be finishing their unit on steady beat and beginning to learn about musical opposites (loud/soft and fast/slow). The second grade classes will be learning how to create, perform and notate rhythms using quarter notes, quarter rests, two eighth notes, half notes and half rests. The third grade students will also begin reviewing the rhythms that they learned in second grade and adding the dotted half note, whole note and whole rest. The fourth graders will be going even further and adding eighth note triplets and a pattern called a “syn-co-pa” (eighth-quarter-eighth notes). Fourth graders will also be learning traditional notation on a staff with measures and time signatures as they write their own rhythms.

The 5th graders have just begun working on their musical which is a tribute to our nation's veterans and will be performed for family and friends on Thursday evening, November 10th at 7:00 p.m., and at a Veterans Day assembly at 9:30 a.m. on Friday, November 11th, for our staff, students, and veteran guests. Each family is encouraged to invite any veterans or active duty members of the military that you know to the morning activities on November 11th. We will also again be collecting donations for Operation Care Package to support those soldiers and sailors who currently serving overseas during the holidays. Detailed information about these activities will be sent home with your students during the month of October. This is such a great event to honor those who have served or are serving our country to protect the freedoms we enjoy. I hope that you will all mark November 10th and 11th on your calendar and plan to attend. Please watch for the details to come home with your child around the middle of October!

From the Art Room...

The start to a new year brings busy artists in the art room, and students are getting into the fall spirit in their art creations.

1st grade has been creating fall themed artworks. Combining watercolors and crayons in their artwork, first graders created happy fall scarecrows with many fall theme details. Students learned how shapes are used to create many different details on the scarecrow's body.

In October, first graders are going to learn about the famous artist Piet Mondrian and his well-known abstract paintings that used straight lines, squares and rectangles, and the primary colors. They will also create their own Mondrian style paintings, using the three main Mondrian style elements in their art masterpieces.

2nd grade learned about the famous artist Henri Rousseau, and his exotic jungle paintings. Second grade students then created their own Rousseau inspired artworks with large jungle cats surrounded by many jungle plants and hidden animals.

Coming up in October second grade students will be creating mixed up animal monsters based off the book "Where the Wild Things Are". For this project students will create monsters using three or more animal body parts or animal pattern details. After coming up with their own unique monsters they will combine the use of oil pastels with watercolor for the colorful finished piece.

3rd grade students celebrated the 'International Dot Day' in September. International Dot Day is inspired by the book "The Dot" by Peter Reynolds. For their own 'dot' art third grade learned about the abstract artist Wassily Kandinsky and how he used colorful dots to create many of his well-known art pieces. In honor of fall, third graders are creating their own unique colorful fall trees, which have colorful Kandinsky style circles for leaves.

In October, third grade students will be inspired by the famous Vincent Van Gogh painting Starry Night when they create their own starry night pumpkin patch masterpieces. Third grade students will be using oil pastels for the Starry Night sky, creating the Van Gogh effect with their coloring technique. To add a new twist from the Starry Night painting students will be creating a fall inspired pumpkin patch illuminated by their starry night designs.

4th grade students learned about the life and art of American artist Grant Wood. Fourth grade students then created their own Grant Wood inspired farm country landscapes combining bright markers with watercolors in their masterpieces.

Coming up in October, students will be learning about the festive celebrations and traditions of Mexico's Day of the Dead taking place at the end of the month. Fourth grade students will be creating their own sugar skull design artwork that focused on the symmetrical and very detailed designs of the traditional sugar skulls that are found only around this special time of year.

5th grade, students have been creating bright, eye catching animal paintings in honor of Hispanic Heritage month, inspired by the traditional folk art of Mexico known as Amate Paintings. This traditional artwork of Mexico features bright stylized animals, flowers, and designs taken from the Mexican culture and art.

In October, fifth grade students will be learning about the famous Pablo Picasso and his cubist art style. Fifth grade students will put a Halloween theme twist on the traditional cubist style portraits that made Picasso so well known. Choosing from the traditional Halloween characters students will use the cubist ideas of adding multi-views of the subject into one portrait, which results in a new twist on Halloween.

Marker Recycling in the Art Room

Did you know that those old, dried out markers can be transformed into clean-burning fuel? Crayola Corporation has launched a green initiative, "Crayola ColorCycle," that encourages K-12 schools throughout North America to save their old dried up markers to send in to be recycled into useable energy. This year in the art room we are continuing to collect old dried up markers to contribute to this environmental friendly cause. If you have any old markers you would like to donate please send them with your child to school to be add to the donation box in the art room. Any marker brand can be donated, including dry erase markers and highlighters. One box of markers can create enough energy to cook an egg, make toast, and brew a pot of coffee! Let's see how many markers Churchill can collect this year to continue to help make a positive environmental difference!

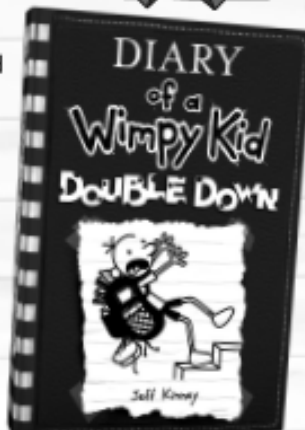

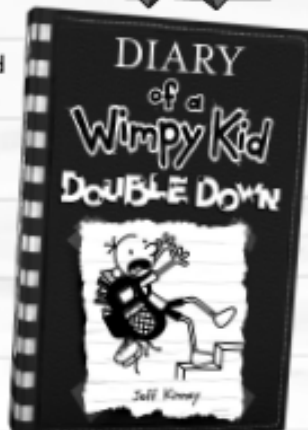
