Meeting Types?

Meeting Invitations



- Notifications of Conference (NOC) must be sent 10 days prior to the meeting unless the 10 day notification is waived by the parent
- Notification must include all school or district team members who will be attending the meeting
- Students at 14 years of age should be invited to attend the meeting
- Parents' invitees are not added to the Notification of Conference but they can invite additional participants
- Information that will be discussed (e.g., evaluation report information, goal updates, draft goals) should be sent home to the parent 3 days prior to the meeting
- Procedural Safeguards should be sent home together with the NOC
- Parents should be asked prior to the meeting if an interpreter is needed - the District must provide an interpreter if the parents indicated that one is needed

Meeting Attendees



- For any IEP meeting, the following members should always be invited:
 - Local Education Agency (LEA) representative
 - Parent
 - General Education Representative
 - Special Education Representative
- Additional team members would be invited based upon services that are needed for the student



Parent Participation



- Parents are an integral member of the team and their input within the team decision-making process is of paramount importance
- Parents are typically asked to provide information to the team regarding their child's strengths and areas of concern

Present Levels



- The team provides information regarding the student's current levels of performance in the academic and functional areas
- If the student has a current IEP, the team discusses the progress made toward the goals and objectives
- Additional information may be provided by the parent in order to assist the school-based team members in better understanding the student's needs and strengths



Goals and Accommodations



- The team provides information regarding the proposed goals for the new IEP year relative to the identified educational needs and adverse effects of the disability
- Accommodations are discussed within the team
 - Accommodations are supports provided for the student to enable the student to access educational programming
 - Accommodations are not 'elective' - and cannot be considered on an 'as needed' basis
 - Assistive technology also needs to be considered on an annual basis
 - Testing accommodations should reflect what the student needs - these accommodations should be provided for each testing session
- Modifications are discussed within the team
 - Modifications are changes made to the curricular materials or to the student's assignments or work



Services & Placement



- Placement decisions are predicated on student goals and minutes of service identified as needed by the team
- Minutes of service are usually described as 'weekly' or 'monthly'
- Placement decisions are considered within the 'too restrictive', 'not sufficient to meet student needs' and 'appropriate' categories

Transportation & ESY



- Specialized transportation is considered by the team if the student is in need to support on the bus ride to/from school
- Extended School Year (ESY) services are considered by the team if there are concerns that schooling intervals will result in a regression of skills that cannot be recouped comparable to peers
- ESY discussions are considered on an annual basis; if IEP meetings are scheduled early in the school year, the team may reconvene in the spring to discuss the need for ESY

Waiver to Begin Services



- At the conclusion of the IEP meeting, parents have the option of waiving the 10 day waiting period before beginning services as discussed in the IEP
- Parents should be requested for the District to request Medicaid reimbursement if the student qualifies (only required one time)
- Parents should be provided the District Behavior Policy at the initial IEP and annually thereafter
