<u>Administrative Procedure – Spectator Conduct at School Events or Meetings</u>

<u>Individuals</u> who behave in an unsportsmanlike or disruptive manner during any school event or meeting (including Board meetings)

Actor	Action
Community members, Staff, Students, Parents or Spectators	Direct any concerns about unsportsmanlike conduct and/or disruptive behavior to the Superintendent (Board of Education meetings) or designee. For unsportsmanlike or disruptive conduct at school meetings, events, or athletic contests concerns are to be directed to the Building Principal.
	Individuals displaying the conduct or behavior may be immediately removed/ejected from the event or meeting by a security officer or School District employee.
	Failure by disruptive individuals to comply with a request to leave the premises by a security officer or School District employee may result in: ending/suspending the meeting in progress or relocating the meeting immediately (i.e. Board of Education meeting), or a request by a security officer or School District employee for the support of local law enforcement during other meetings or events.
Superintendent or designee or Building Principal	Investigate all complaints/concerns regarding unsportsmanlike/disruptive behavior including, but not limited to: vulgar/obscene language, possessing/under the influence of alcoholic beverages/illegal substances, possessing a weapon or object that could reasonably be considered a weapon or look-alike, fighting or otherwise striking or threatening another person, failure to obey instructions of a security officer, local law enforcement or School District employee, engaging in any activity that is illegal or disruptive.
	Note : The Executive Director of District Student Services ensures that all buildings in the district are operating uniformly, and in accordance with these administrative procedures.
Superintendent or designee or Building Principal	Upon completion of the investigation of reports regarding unsportsmanlike and/or disruptive conduct, meets with individuals to inform them of the problem behaviors or conduct and the resulting actions to be taken (removal, ejection, no trespass, etc.)
	Building level concerns of unsportsmanlike conduct or disruptive conduct: Informs the Executive Director of Student Services of the event, individuals involved, outcome of meetings with individuals who have violated policy 8:40 by their conduct, and consequences to be issued and enforced up to and including a no trespass notification.
