### **National Mole Day**

Mole Day is an unofficial holiday celebrated annually between 6:02 am to 6:02 pm on October 23 by chemists and chemistry students in honor of the mole, a measuring unit in Chemistry. When written in time, month/date format, the digits are associated with Avogadro's number of 6.02x10<sup>23</sup>. The mole measures chemical entities such as atoms or molecules and is formally defined as the amount of any substance that contains as many entities as there are atoms in 12 grams of carbon-12.

### Teacher of the Year, Outstanding Early Educators & Those Who Excel

Awards of Excellence, Meritorious Service, and Special Recognition were to be presented in the Teacher of the Year, Outstanding Early Educators and Those Who Excel programs at ISBE's Award

banquet on October 17th. Unfortunately, due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic and restrictions in place limiting large gatherings, this year's in-person event was canceled. Since 1970, the Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE) has sponsored the Illinois Teacher of the Year, Outstanding Early Career Educator and Those Who Excel programs, recognizing all public and nonpublic preK-12 educators in Illinois. The Teacher of the Year category recognizes those with more than five years of teaching experience. The top nominees from eight regions are designated as Regional Teachers of the Year; the Illinois Teacher of the Year is selected from that cohort. Bilingual, Early Childhood, and Special Education Teachers of the Year are also recognized from those nominees. The Outstanding Early Career Educator award is presented to the top teacher in Illinois with one-four years of teaching experience. The Those Who Excel program honors individuals in the following five categories: school administrator, student support personnel, educational service personnel, community volunteer and teams. Nomination materials for Illinois Teacher of the Year, Outstanding Early Career Educator and Those Who Excel nominees are evaluated by a selection committee comprised of individuals who represent a variety of educational organizations.

## **Elementary Remote Planning Day - Friday, October 30**

Elementary Only: There will be a remote planning day on Friday, October 30 for teachers to prepare for in-person instruction beginning November 9, so there will not be typical classes held through Google Classroom or Google Hangouts with classroom teachers. Elementary Remote For All student's last day that week will be Thursday, October 29. Also, parent/teacher conferences have been moved to a later date so that teachers have an opportunity to work with students during inperson instruction before having conferences with parents. Therefore, Monday, November 23 will be a five-hour student day, and more information will come out in the next few weeks about what this day will look like for both in-person and remote students. Remote conferences will happen that evening from 4 pm -8 pm. Tuesday, November 24 will be a non-student attendance day and will be used for remote parent/teacher conferences from 8 am - 1 pm. This Remote Planning Day does not impact students who participate in self-contained Special Education programs that have already returned to school. This will continue to be an attendance day for these students.
