On This Date in History:

December 18th - International Migrants Day

On December 4, 2000, the General Assembly, taking into account the large and increasing number of migrants in the world, proclaimed today as International Migrants Day. Hybrid In-Person and Remote by Choice Instruction Information

We plan to move into hybrid instruction in a staggered approach. This is being done to make sure we have adequate assistance to support staff as they switch to new technology, new ways of tracking COVID for students and new modes of instruction. The emphasis is on moving our neediest and youngest students to the hybrid model as soon as we can.

Staff should be prepared to be at work in the schools for at least one full day on January 13th. Staff should also be prepared for students to move to the hybrid and remote by choice options as early as January 19th. We realize that we will need to watch COVID rates during Winter Break and may possibly need to change plans but we want the staff to know our most optimistic plans for returning students to some in-person instruction. We will provide another update by January 11th.

It is our hope that staff and students will work/learn more in person as the semester progresses.

REMINDER -- 6 Feet Apart - At ALL Times!

All adults should be at least six feet apart while at work. It might be hard to visualize what six feet looks like. Some common items that are six feet or further are: a king size bed, an adult bike from front to back, a three cushion sofa, and the length of a yoga mat.

COVID-19 Information (PLEASE READ)

- All staff members are expected to socially distance at least six feet from each other.
 School buildings are large with plenty of available space to spread out. Consider virtual meetings whenever possible, and when in-person with others use large spaces to allow for at least six feet of distance between individuals.
- Step 1- Report! Remember any staff or student reporting symptoms, exposure, or a positive
 case must use the District <u>COVID Reporting Form</u> to communicate this information to the
