Website Accessibility - Write Plainly

Accessible writing is good writing. It makes your content easier for everyone to consume. Documentation is only as good as what people can get out of it. If the writing is too

complicated, people won't be able to use it. Plain language improves accessibility. Keep sentences short (20-25 words at most). Use words or combinations of words with 1-2 syllables when possible. For example, use "to" instead of "in order to". Contractions are acceptable to use. Use the Hemmingway Editor to measure the readability of your text. The Web Content Accessibility Guidelines (WCAG) standard is to aim for a readability level of grade 8 and lower.
