BCBS COVID-19 Update

Effective March 18, 2020, BCBSIL began covering testing services related to the COVID-19 at no cost share to members. In addition, expanded coverage of telehealth services provided through an already contracted vendor or physician will also be available, at no cost share to members, through April 30, 2020. This means qualified members whose own provider offers telehealth service will now have that service covered as a regular office visit. This coverage benefit is in addition to the telehealth benefits currently being offered to eligible members by MDLIVE. Covered telehealth visits currently include two-way, live interactive telephone communication and digital video consultations, which can allow concerned members to connect with their physicians while reducing the risk of exposure to contagious viruses or further illness. This added service is currently only available for employees enrolled in either the PPO or HCA, through April 30, 2020.
