### Take Advantage of Newly Eligible Over-the-Counter Health Products

As a part of the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act passed into federal law on March 27<sup>th</sup>, 2020, many new health care products are now eligible for purchase with FSA funds. Over-the-counter drugs (antihistamines, antacids, cold medications, etc.) no longer require a prescription to be purchased with FSA dollars, and Feminine/menstrual care products are now medically eligible products.

If you purchased these items after January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2020 and have kept your receipts, you can file a claim for reimbursement from your spending account. Most stores and online retail outlets will be updating their inventory and point-of-sale systems to reflect these new changes on or before the end of May, 2020, which will allow you to use your Navia Benefits Card to purchase these items on an ongoing basis. Your Navia card may be declined if you attempt to use it to purchase OTC products during the period where retail stores are updating their systems.
