Safety Reminder about Doors

As a reminder, the following procedures are in place for our district:

Closed & Locked Door Requirement (during classroom instruction):

Per Office of State Fire Marshal (OSFM), doors to all classrooms/occupied spaces must be closed/latched. (OSFM & 308 requirement)

Additionally, doors to all classrooms, offices, storage areas, locker rooms must be closed & locked-specifically this means all classrooms during instruction (and any other space when unsupervised or vacant) (308 requirement)

NO wedges/props, magnetic strips over latch areas, unapproved barricade devices, etc. may be used, provided or approved in District 308. (OSFM & 308 requirement)

Dr. Sparlin Addresses ISBE

Dr. Sparlin addressed the Illinois State Board of Education in Chicago today in regards to public school funding in Illinois. He urged the board to advocate for the funds that are necessary in order to meet the funding targets set with the new Evidence Based Funding model. The law states schools will be fully funded by 2027, however the state is on track for not reaching that target until 2038.
