# Introduction and History

School districts in Illinois have been mandated by the State to have each of their schools surveyed for life safety and other issues every 10 years, and to have a report prepared that certifies the buildings are in compliance with applicable codes, or describes the work required to bring its facilities into compliance.

Kluber Architects + Engineers has been engaged by District 308 to have its qualified professionals conduct the surveys and prepare the report for its 14 elementary schools, 5 junior high schools, 2 high schools and its early learning center.

#### **Current stats:**

- 22 school buildings totaling over 3.2 million square feet of building space
- Over 540 acres of property
- 6 additional buildings since last survey
- Major additions/remodeling to 9 buildings since last survey



# **Process and Methodology**

- 1. Qualified professionals survey school buildings to determine compliance with the Health Life Safety Code for Public Schools, Part 180. Depending on the age of the school, varying code requirements apply to each building. Any violations found are prioritized in accordance with the following:
  - a. Urgent: Items that present an immediate hazard to the safety of students. These violations must be addressed with in 1 year. Examples: Structural; egress; fire protection; fire detection.
  - b. Required: Items that are necessary for a safe environment, but present less of an immediate hazard to the safety of students. These violations must be addressed with in 5 years.
  - c. Recommended: Items that do not present any immediate hazard to the students. Examples: Energy conservation; security; repair of school sidewalks, playgrounds, or parking lots; accessibility.

The qualified professionals then prepare a report documenting the violations and recommended actions to be taken to correct the violations, including associated costs. They also update the Safety Reference Plans and Safety Reference Documents for the buildings.

# Process and Methodology (continued)

- 2. Board of Education reviews the report and approves the recommendations for corrective action. The District may decide to utilize fire prevention and safety funds to accomplish portions of the work required to bring buildings into compliance.
- 3. Qualified professional enters the violations found for each building into the ISBE Web Application Security (IWAS) online system and uploads supporting documents (i.e. Safety Reference Plans and Safety Reference Documents) to the system. Together, all of this information makes up the Ten Year Safety Survey Report for each building. The qualified professional also submits a certified Application for Approval through the IWAS system, accompanying the Report.
- 4. If the Board of Education decides to utilize fire prevention and safety funds to accomplish any portion of the work, the qualified professional also opens a Health and Life Safety Amendment within the IWAS system and prepares a Certificate of Need to be sent to the Regional Superintendent.
- 5. If fire prevention and safety funds will be used for paving work, the District must hold a public hearing on the matter.
- 6. Board of Education approves and submits to the Regional Superintendent the Ten Year Safety Survey Report (and associated HLS Amendment, if present) through the IWAS system.



# Process and Methodology (continued)

- 7. Regional Superintendent reviews and approves the Application and Report and issues a Certificate of Approval (or notifies the District of any deficiencies in either).
- 8. State Superintendent reviews the Application and Report and issues a Certificate of Approval (or notifies the District of any deficiencies).
- If an HLS Amendment was opened in the IWAS system, the Regional Superintendent issues an Order of Effect. This needs to be submitted by the District, along with Certificates of Approval from the Regional and State Superintendents, to the County Clerk.
- 10. The District reports to the Regional Superintendent annually on the progress towards completion of any work towards correcting the violations cited in the Report.



# **Executive Summary**

# Key Points:

- District facilities are in good condition, overall.
- Certain improvements are not eligible for inclusion in a Ten Year Life Safety Survey. Examples include: new air conditioning systems, new sprinkler systems.
- 308 Center is not included in this Ten Year Life Safety Survey, because it will not be occupied by students, beginning January, 2018.





# Summary of Findings:

- Approximately \$4.46 million in total projected costs over the 10 year period
  - \$560,000 in violations classified as "a" priority requiring correction within 1 year.
  - \$1.65 million in violations classified as "b" priority" requiring correction within 5 years.
  - \$2.25 million in recommended corrections and improvements classified as "c" priority requiring correction within 10 years.

President, Members of the Board of Education, and Community Residents of Community Unit School District No. 308 Oswego, Illinois

The Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR) of Community Unit School District No. 308 (the District), Oswego, Illinois, as of and for the year ended June 30, 2017, is submitted herewith. Responsibility for the accuracy of the presented data and the completeness and fairness of the presentation, including all disclosures, rests with the District. We believe the data, as presented, is accurate in all material aspects; that is presented in a manner designed to fairly set forth the financial position and results of operations of the District as shown by the disclosure of all financial activity of its various funds; and that all disclosures necessary for public understanding of the District's financial status have been incorporated within this report.

Management's discussion and analysis (MD&A) immediately follows the independent auditor's report and provides a narrative introduction, overview, and analysis of the basic financial statements. MD&A complements this letter and should be read in conjunction with it.

#### **Financial Statements**

The CAFR includes all funds and account groups of the District and is presented in three sections: Introductory, Financial, and Statistical. The introductory section includes this transmittal letter, the District's organizational chart, and a list of principal officers and elected officials. The financial section includes the independent auditors' report on financial statements and schedules, Management's Discussion and Analysis (MD&A), basic financial statements and required and other supplemental information such as the combining and individual fund financial statements and schedules. The statistical section includes selected financial and demographic information, generally presented on a multi-year basis.

The District is required to undergo an annual single audit in conformity with the provisions of the U.S. Office of Management and Budget's (OMB) *Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards (Uniform Guidance)*. Information related to this single audit, including a schedule of federal financial assistance and the independent auditors' reports on the internal control structure and on compliance with applicable laws and regulations, is included under separate cover.

The financial reporting entity of the District is to include the District, as the primary government, organizations for which the District is financially accountable and other organizations for which the nature and significance of their relationship with the District are such that exclusion would cause the District's financial statements to be misleading or incomplete. Based on these criteria there are no other organizations or agencies whose financial statements should be combined with the general purpose financial statements of the District.

#### History of the District

The District began as a single school building in 1837. Over the next 100 years the residents were served by a separate elementary and high school district. Then in 1961 the voters approved consolidating into a single unit district creating Oswego CUSD No. 308 as it stands today. The District is made up of 68.6 square miles in Kendall, Will and Kane Counties, Illinois and currently serves approximately 18,043 students from Oswego, Montgomery, Aurora, Plainfield, Joliet and unincorporated portions of Kendall and Will Counties in Illinois.

#### Accounting Systems and Budgetary Control

The District administration is responsible for establishing and maintaining internal controls designed to ensure that the assets of the District are protected from loss, theft, or misuse and to ensure that adequate accounting data are compiled to allow for the preparation of financial statements in conformity with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles. The internal controls are designed to provide reasonable, but not absolute, assurance that these objectives are met. The concept of reasonable assurance recognizes that the cost of a control should not exceed the benefits likely to be derived and the valuation of costs and benefits requires estimates and judgments by management.

Budgetary control is maintained at line item levels within each program and/or cost centers before being combined to form totals by fund. All actual activity compared to budget is reported to the District's management on a monthly basis. This monthly report compares each line item account balance to the annual budget with accumulation to the cost center and fund levels. Full disclosures are made if extraordinary variances appear during the year. A description of the budget development cycle is discussed in detail in Note 1 to the required supplementary information.

#### General Governmental Activities

The general governmental activities include all services provided by the District. Included are the general, special revenue, debt service and capital project funds. The activities include all instructional, maintenance, and administrative costs of the district.

Property taxes are the most significant revenue source of the District. The factors that affect property tax revenues are assessed valuation, tax multiplier, tax rate, CPI and new property.

Other revenue sources consist of local revenues exclusive of property taxes. These include transportation fees, tuition, student activity fees, and building rentals.

The equalized assessed valuation of the District of \$1,788,565,064 represents an increase in the tax base of 6.33% over the preceding year. The tax multiplier is determined by a state agency which attempts to equalize the assessment on real property in order to determine the property value for taxing purposes. This value is referred to as the equalized assessed valuation (E.A.V.).

Real estate tax bills in Kendall, Kane and Will Counties are payable in two equal installments in June and September. Allocations of tax rates for the 2016 property tax levy for fiscal 2017 and the preceding two fiscal years are as follows (per \$100 assessed value):

In FY18, the school leadership team is developing a comprehensive priorities and initiatives plan. It will address budget balancing, curriculum, accountability, grading, promotion and student improvement in compliance with the Every Student Succeeds Act and the Evidence Based Funding Model.

#### **Debt Administration**

The ratio of general bonded debt to assessed valuation and the amount of bonded debt per capita are useful indicators of the District's debt position to District management, citizens, and investors. On August 21, 2017, the Board approved to refinance \$16.72 million of existing debt to create debt service savings and to modify the debt burden of the District.

The State of Illinois limits unit school districts to a debt to assessed valuation ratio of 13.8%. However, the District has the statutory authority to issue debt up to a ratio of 15% after being certified as a fast growth district by the Regional Superintendent of Schools under the provisions of 105 ILCS 5/19-1 (b). The District has statutory authority to exceed those limitations by the following legislative acts:

 Public Act 93-13, effective June 9, 2003 amended the statutory debt capacity of the District up to 20% of assessed valuation in order to complete the \$155 million in projects authorized in the November 2002 referendum until November 1, 2007. 105 ILCS 5/19.1 (o) Public Act 94-1068, effective January 9, 2007, allowed the District to issue the \$450 million in building bonds authorized by the voters of the District by referendum in November 2006 without having those bonds count against the statutory debt limitations. 105 ILCS 5/19.1 (p15)

The District's current bond ratings are: Moody's Investor Services is Aa3 with a negative outlook and Fitch is AA with a negative outlook.

#### Local Economy and Economic Outlook

The general economic outlook for the Oswego area is moderate. The District's economic base continues to be diversified with new improvements scheduled for the downtown Oswego area. It is expected that development will continue at a steady rate in the foreseeable future with new construction coming from commercial and residential properties. Current projections continue to provide a stable economic outlook for the District.

#### Independent Audit

The School Code of Illinois and the District require an annual audit of the financial statements of all funds of the District. The audit for the year ended June 30, 2017 was performed by Baker Tilly, independent certified public accountants, who were selected by the District's Board of Education. Their report has been included in the financial section of this report.



#### Report on the Financial Statements

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of the governmental activities, each major fund, and the aggregate remaining fund information of Community Unit School District 308, as of and for the year ended June 30, 2017, and the related notes to the financial statements, which collectively comprise Community Unit School District 308's basic financial statements as listed in the table of contents.

#### Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

# Community Unit School District 308 Management's Discussion and Analysis (Unaudited) As of and for the Year Ended June 30, 2017

The discussion and analysis of Community Unit School District 308's (the "District") financial performance provides an overall review of the District's financial activities as of and for the year ended June 30, 2017. The management of the District encourages readers to consider the information presented herein in conjunction with the transmittal letter found in the introductory section and the basic financial statements to enhance their understanding of the District's financial performance. All amounts, unless otherwise indicated, are expressed in millions of dollars. Certain comparative information between the current year and the prior is required to be presented in the Management's Discussion and Analysis (the "MD&A").

#### **Financial Highlights**

- In total, net position decreased by \$1.5. This represents a 9% decrease from 2016 and was attributed primarily to increased instruction costs in the current year.
- General revenues accounted for \$183.8 in revenue or 68% of all revenues. Program specific revenues in the form of charges for services and fees and grants accounted for \$86.3 or 32% of total revenues of \$270.1.
- The District had \$271.6 in expenses related to government activities. However, only \$86.3 of these expenses were offset by program specific charges and grants.

#### **Overview of the Financial Statements**

This discussion and analysis is intended to serve as an introduction to the District's basic financial statements. The basic financial statements are comprised of three components:

- Government-wide financial statements,
- Fund financial statements, and
- Notes to basic financial statements.

This report also contains other supplementary information in addition to the basic financial statements.

#### Government-wide financial statements

The government-wide financial statements are designed to provide readers with a broad overview of the District's finances, in a manner similar to a private-sector business.

The statement of net position presents information on all of the District's assets/deferred outflows of resources and liabilities/deferred inflows of resources, with the difference between them reported as net position. Over time, increases or decreases in net position may serve as a useful indicator of whether the financial position of the District is improving or deteriorating.

The statement of activities presents information showing how the government's net position changed during the fiscal year being reported. All changes in net position are reported as soon as the underlying event giving rise to the change occurs, regardless of the timing of related cash flows. Thus, revenues and expenses are reported in this statement for some items that will only result in cash flows in future fiscal periods.

The government-wide financial statements present the functions of the District that are principally supported by taxes and intergovernmental revenues (governmental activities). The District has no business-type activities; that is, functions that are intended to recover all or a significant portion of their costs through user fees and charges. The District's governmental activities include instructional services (regular education, special education and other), supporting services, operation and maintenance of facilities and transportation services.

#### Fund financial statements

A fund is a grouping of related accounts that is used to maintain control over resources that have been segregated for specific activities or objectives. The District uses fund accounting to ensure and demonstrate compliance with finance-related legal requirements. All of the funds of the District can be divided into two categories: governmental funds and fiduciary funds (the District maintains no proprietary funds).

Governmental funds are used to account for essentially the same functions reported as governmental activities in the government-wide financial statements. However, unlike the government-wide financial statements, governmental fund financial statements focus on near-term inflows and outflows of spendable resources, as well as on balances of spendable resources available at the end of the fiscal year. Such information may be useful in evaluating a school district's near-term financing requirements.

Because the focus of governmental funds is narrower than that of the government-wide financial statements, it is useful to compare the information presented for governmental funds with similar information presented for governmental activities in the government-wide financial statements. By doing so, readers may better understand the long-term impact of the government's near-term financing decisions. Both the governmental fund balance sheet and the governmental fund statement of revenues, expenditures and changes in fund balances provide a reconciliation to facilitate this comparison between governmental funds and governmental activities.

The District maintains seven individual governmental funds. Information is presented separately in the governmental fund balance sheet and in the governmental fund statement of revenues, expenditures and changes in fund balances for the General Fund, Operations and Maintenance Fund, Transportation Fund, IMRF/Social Security Fund, Debt Service Fund, Capital Projects Fund, and Fire Prevention and Safety Fund, all of which are considered to be major funds.

The District adopts an annual budget for each of the funds listed above. A budgetary comparison schedule has been provided for each fund to demonstrate compliance with this budget.

Fiduciary funds are used to account for resources held for the benefit of parties outside the School District. Fiduciary funds are not reflected in the government-wide financial statement because the resources of those funds are not available to support the District's own programs. The accounting used for fiduciary funds is much like that for the government-wide financial statements.

# Notes to basic financial statements

The notes to the financial statements provide additional information that is essential to a full understanding of the data provided in the government-wide and fund financial statements.

# Other information

In addition to the basic financial statements and accompanying notes, this report also presents certain required supplementary information concerning the District's pension benefits.

# **Government-Wide Financial Analysis**

The District's combined net position was lower on June 30, 2017, than it was the year before, decreasing 9% to \$16.5.



Expenses in the governmental activities of the District of \$271.6 exceeded revenues by \$1.5. This was attributable primarily to increased instruction costs in the current year.



Property taxes accounted for the largest portion of the District's revenues, contributing 47%. The remainder of revenues came from state, federal grants and other sources. The total cost of all the District's programs was \$271.6, mainly related to instructing and caring for the students and student transportation at 76%.

# **Financial Analysis of the District's Funds**

The District's Governmental Funds balance increased from \$43.7 to \$49.9.

Individual fund balances increased/decreased in the current year as follows: General Fund increased from \$15.4 to \$22.7, Transportation Fund increased from \$7.8 to \$8.4, Operations and Maintenance Fund decreased from \$1.9 to \$1.0, and Capital Projects Fund decreased from \$3.2 to \$2.3. Fund balance in the IMRF Fund, Debt Service Fund and Fire Prevention and Life Safety Fund had slight increases in the current year.

# **General Fund Budgetary Highlights**

The School District's budget, is prepared according to Illinois law using the modified accrual basis of accounting, which is the same basis that is used for financial reporting, except that pension contributions made by the State of Illinois on-behalf of the School District, for which revenues and expenditures are equal, are not included in either budgeted revenues or expenditures.

For the General Fund, actual revenues were approximately \$153 million, 0.6% less than budgeted and actual expenditures were \$159.2 million, 1.8% more than budgeted for a net variance of \$3.7 million.

# **Capital Assets and Debt Administration**

# Capital assets

By the end of 2017, the District had compiled a total investment of \$501.7 (\$367.2 net of accumulated depreciation) in a broad range of capital assets including buildings, land and equipment. Total depreciation expense for the year was \$11.2. More detailed information about capital assets can be found in Note 5 of the basic financial statements.

#### Long-term debt

The District retired \$19.9 in bonds and issued \$19.2 in bonds in 2017. Capital leases and other were increased by \$4.8. At the end of fiscal 2017, the District had a debt margin of \$144.2. More detailed information on long-term debt can be found in Note 7 of the basic financial statements.

# **Factors Bearing on the District's Future**

At the time these financial statements were prepared and audited, the District was aware of the following circumstances that will significantly affect financial operations in the future:

In FY 2017 the District absorbed the remaining special education cooperative employees making it the largest employer in Kendall County.

The District continues to pursue cost cutting measures and new revenue streams that will be needed to balance the FY 2019 budget and beyond.

# **Requests for Information**

This financial report is designed to provide the District's citizens, taxpayers, and creditors with a general overview of the District's finances and to demonstrate the District's accountability for the money it receives. # NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Community Unit School District 308 (the "District") operates as a public school system governed by a seven-member board. The District is organized under the School Code of the State of Illinois, as amended. The accounting policies of the District conform to the accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, as applicable to local governmental units of this type. The following is a summary of the more significant accounting policies of the District:

# **Reporting Entity**

This report includes all of the funds of the District. The reporting entity for the District consists of the primary government and its component units. Component units are legally separate organizations for which the primary government is financially accountable or other organizations for which the nature and significance of their relationship with the primary government are such that their exclusion would cause the reporting entity's financial statements to be misleading. The District has not identified any organizations that meet this criteria.

#### **Basis of Presentation**

#### Government-wide Financial Statements

The government-wide financial statements (i.e., the statement of net position and the statement of activities) report information on all of the nonfiduciary activities of the District. The effect of interfund activity has been removed from these statements. The District's operating activities are all considered "governmental activities", that is, activities normally supported by taxes and intergovernmental revenues. The District has no operating activities that would be considered "business activities".

The statement of activities demonstrates the degree to which the direct expenses of a given function are offset by program revenues. Direct expenses are those that are clearly identifiable with a specific function. Program revenues include: (1) amounts paid by the recipient of goods or services offered by the program and (2) grants and contributions that are restricted to meeting the operational or capital requirements of a particular function. Taxes and other items not properly included among program revenues are reported instead as general revenues.

#### Governmental Funds Financial Statements

Governmental funds financial statements are organized and operated on the basis of funds and are used to account for the District's general governmental activities. Fund accounting segregates funds according to their intended purpose, and is used to aid management in demonstrating compliance with finance-related legal and contractual provisions. A fund is an independent fiscal and accounting entity with a self-balancing set of accounts that comprise its assets, deferred outflows of resources, liabilities, deferred inflows of resources, reserves, fund balance, revenues and expenditures. The minimum number of funds is maintained consistent with legal and managerial requirements.

Separate financial statements are provided for all governmental funds and fiduciary funds; the fiduciary funds are excluded from the government-wide financial statements.

# **Measurement Focus and Basis of Accounting**

The government-wide financial statements are reported using the economic resources measurement focus, while the fiduciary fund statements do not have a measurement focus. The government-wide financial statements and the fiduciary fund financial statements are reported using the accrual basis of accounting. Revenues are recorded when earned and expenses are recorded when a liability is incurred, regardless of the timing of related cash flows. Property taxes are recognized as revenues in the year for which they are levied. Grants and similar items are recognized as revenue when all eligibility requirements have been met.

Governmental fund financial statements are reported using the flow of current financial resources measurement focus and the modified accrual basis of accounting. Revenues are recognized when they are both "measurable and available". "Measurable" means that the amount of the transaction can be determined, and "available" means collectible within the current period or soon enough thereafter to pay liabilities of the current period. For this purpose, the District considers all revenues available if they are collected within 60 days after year-end. Expenditures are recorded when the related fund liability is incurred. However, expenditures for unmatured principal and interest on general long-term debt are recognized when due; and certain compensated absences, claims and judgments are recognized when the obligations are expected to be liquidated with expendable available financial resources.

# Major Governmental Funds

<u>General Fund</u> - the general operating fund of the District. It accounts for all financial resources except those required to be accounted for in another fund. This fund is primarily used for most of the instructional and administrative aspects of the District's operations. Revenues consist largely of local property taxes and state government aid.

<u>Special Revenue Funds</u> - account for the proceeds of specific revenue sources that are legally restricted or committed to expenditures for specified purposes, other than those accounted for in the Debt Service Fund, Capital Projects Funds or Fiduciary Funds.

Operations and Maintenance Fund - accounts for expenditures made for repair and maintenance of the District's buildings and land. Revenue consists primarily of local property taxes.

*Transportation Fund* - accounts for all revenue and expenditures made for student transportation. Revenue is derived primarily from local property taxes and state reimbursement grants.

Municipal Retirement/Social Security Fund - accounts for the District's portion of pension contributions to the Illinois Municipal Retirement Fund, payments to Medicare, and payments to the Social Security System for non-certified employees. Revenue to finance the contributions is derived primarily from local property taxes and personal property replacement taxes.

<u>Debt Service Fund</u> - accounts for the accumulation of resources that are restricted, committed, or assigned for, and the payment of, long-term debt principal, interest and related costs. The primary revenue source is local property taxes levied specifically for debt service.

<u>Capital Project Funds</u> - accounts for the financial resources that are restricted, committed, or assigned to be used for the acquisition or construction of, and/or additions to, major capital facilities.

Capital Projects Fund - accounts for construction projects and renovations financed through bond issuances.

# NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES - (CONTINUED)

Fire Prevention and Life Safety Fund - accounts for State-approved life safety projects financed through serial bond issues or local property taxes levied specifically for such purposes.

# Other Fund Types

<u>Fiduciary Funds</u> - account for assets held by the District in a trustee capacity or as an agent for individuals, private organizations, other governments or other funds.

Agency Funds - include Student Activity Funds, Convenience Accounts and Other Agency Funds. These funds are custodial in nature and do not present results of operations or have a measurement focus. Although the Board of Education has the ultimate responsibility for Activity Funds, they are not local education agency funds. Student Activity Funds account for assets held by the District which are owned, operated and managed generally by the student body, under the guidance and direction of adults or a staff member, for educational, recreational or cultural purposes. Convenience Accounts account for assets that are normally maintained by a local education agency as a convenience for its faculty, staff, etc.

On-behalf payments (payments made by a third party for the benefit of the district, such as payments made by the state to the Teachers' Retirement System) have been recognized in the financial statements.

Property taxes, replacement taxes, certain state and federal aid, and interest on investments are susceptible to accrual. Other receipts become measurable and available when cash is received by the District and recognized as revenue at that time.

Grant funds are considered to be earned to the extent of expenditures made under the provisions of the grant. Accordingly, when such funds are received, they are recorded as unearned revenues until earned.

#### All Financial Statements

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, deferred outflows of resources, liabilities, and deferred inflows of resources and disclosure of contingent assets, deferred outflows of resources, liabilities, and deferred inflows of resources at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenditures/expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

# Assets, Deferred Outflows of Resources, Liabilities, Deferred Inflows of Resources, and Net Position or Equity

#### Deposits and Investments

State statutes authorize the District to invest in obligations of the U.S. Treasury, certain highly-rated commercial paper, corporate bonds, repurchase agreements, and the State Treasurer's Investment Pool. Investments are stated at fair value. Changes in fair value of investments are included as investment income.

# Receivables and Payables

Transactions between funds that are representative of lending/borrowing arrangements outstanding at the end of the fiscal year are referred to as "due to/from other funds". These amounts are eliminated in the governmental activities column in the statement of net position. Receivables are expected to be collected within one year.

#### Unearned Revenue

Governmental funds report unearned revenue in connection with resources that have been received, but not yet earned.

# Property Tax Revenues

The District must file its tax levy resolution by the last Tuesday in December of each year. The District's 2016 levy resolution was approved during the September 26, 2016 board meeting. The District's property tax is levied each year on all taxable real property located in the District and it becomes a lien on the property on January 1 of that year. The owner of real property on January 1 in any year is liable for taxes of that year.

The tax rate ceilings are applied at the fund level. These ceilings are established by state law subject to change only by the approval of the voters of the District.

The PTELA limitation is applied in the aggregate to the total levy (excluding certain levies for the repayment of debt). PTELA limits the increase in total taxes billed to the lessor of 5% or the percentage increase in the Consumer Price Index (CPI) for the preceding year. The amount can be exceeded to the extent there is "new growth" in the District's tax base. The new growth consists of new construction, annexations and tax increment finance district property becoming eligible for taxation. The CPI rates applicable to the 2016 and 2015 tax levies were 0.7% and 0.8%, respectively.

Property taxes are collected by the County Collector/Treasurer, who remits to the District its share of collections. Taxes levied in one year become due and payable in two equal installments: the first due on June 1 and the second due on September 1. Property taxes are normally collected by the District within 60 days of the respective installment dates.

The 2016 property tax levy is recognized as a receivable in fiscal 2017, net of estimated uncollectible amounts approximating 0.10% and less amounts already received. The District considers that the first installment of the 2016 levy is to be used to finance operations in fiscal 2017. The District has determined that the second installment of the 2016 levy is to be used to finance operations in fiscal 2018 and has included the corresponding receivable as a deferred inflow of resources.

# Personal Property Replacement Taxes

Personal property replacement taxes are first allocated to the Municipal Retirement / Social Security Fund, and the balance is allocated to the remaining funds at the discretion of the District.

#### Inventory

Inventories are recorded at the lower of cost or market on a first-in-first-out basis and are expensed when used.

# NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES - (CONTINUED)

#### Prepaid Items

Certain payments to vendors that reflect costs applicable to future accounting periods are recorded as prepaid items in both the government-wide and fund financial statements. The cost of prepaid items is recorded as expenditures/expenses when consumed rather than when purchased.

#### Capital Assets

Capital assets, which include land, construction in progress, land improvements, buildings and building improvements, equipment, vehicles and intangible assets are reported in the government-wide financial statements. Capital assets are defined by the District as assets with an initial individual cost of more than \$5,000 and an estimated useful life of more than 1 year. Such assets are recorded at historical cost or estimated historical cost if purchased or constructed. Donated capital assets are recorded at acquisition value at the date of donation.

Depreciation of capital assets is provided using the straight-line method over the following estimated useful lives:

In the fund financial statements, capital assets used in governmental fund operations are accounted for as capital outlay expenditures of the governmental fund upon acquisition.

#### Deferred Outflows of Resources

A deferred outflow of resources represents a consumption of net position that applies to a future period and will not be recognized as an outflow of resources (expense/expenditure) until that future time.

A deferred charge on refunding arise from advance refunding of debt. The difference between the cost of the securities placed in trust for future payment of refunded debt and the net carrying value of that debt is deferred and amortized as a component of interest expense over the shorter of the term of the refunding issue or the original term of the refunded debt. The unamortized amount is reported as a deferred outflow of resources in the government-wide statements.

#### Compensated Absences

Under terms of employment, employees are granted sick leave and vacations in varying amounts. Only benefits considered to be vested are disclosed in these statements.

All vested vacation and sick leave pay is accrued when incurred in the government-wide financial statements. A liability for these amounts is reported in governmental funds only if they have matured, for example, as a result of employee resignations and retirements, or are payable with expendable available resources.

# NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES - (CONTINUED)

Payments for vacation and sick leave will be made at rates in effect when the benefits are used. Accumulated vacation and sick leave liabilities at June 30, 2017 are determined on the basis of current salary rates and include salary related payments.

All full-time twelve-month maintenance employees are eligible for paid vacation. On July 1 of each year, employees accrue a year of vacation service and upon initial employment, the employee will accrue 1 day per month. Days are earned as follows: 12 days per 0-5 years of service, 18 days for 6-15 years of service, and 24 days for 16 + years of service. Upon termination, following full year of employment, employees shall be compensated at their regular salary rate for unused accrued vacation days.

Administrative employees accrue a year of vacation service on July 1. Upon employment, 12 month administrative employees earn 1 day per month. Days are earned as follows: 12 days for 0-5 years of service, 18 days for 6-15 years, and 24 days for more than 16 years. Vacation days can be carried over to a maximum of double their yearly allotment. Failure to utilize these days will result in the employee forfeiting the days.

Maintenance and transportation employees receive 12 sick days per year, accumulating up to 240 days. IMRF requires 240 days for the maximum benefit of one year toward retirement. For maintenance employees, any days over the 240 days, the District will pay \$60 for each day over 240 days up to and not to exceed 100 days at the time of retirement or termination. If an employee who wishes to retire has a balance of accrued, unused sick leave days under 240, employee will be compensated by the district at a rate of \$80 per day up to 100 days. When a maintenance employee terminates employment with the district for other than retirement, employee shall cash out all unused, accumulated sick leave days at \$60 per day. For transportation employees, any days over 240 days, the District will pay \$80 for each day over 240 days up to and not to exceed 80 days at the time of retirement.

# Long-Term Obligations

In the government-wide financial statements, long-term debt and other long-term obligations are reported as liabilities in the statement of net position. Bond premiums and discounts are deferred and amortized over the life of the applicable bonds using the effective interest method. The balance at year end for premiums/discounts is shown as an increase or decrease in the liability section of the statement of net position.

In the fund financial statements, governmental funds recognize bond premiums and discounts during the period incurred. The face amount of debt issued is reported as other financing sources. Premiums received on debt issuances are reported as other financing sources while discounts on debt issuances are reported as other financing uses.

#### Deferred Inflows of Resources

A deferred inflow of resources represents an acquisition of net position that applies to a future period and therefore will not be recognized as an inflow of resources (revenue) until that future time.

# Equity Classifications

Equity is classified as net position in the government-wide financial statements and displayed in three components:

Net investment in capital assets - Consists of capital assets including restricted capital assets, net of accumulated depreciation and reduced by the outstanding balances of any bonds, mortgages, notes, or other borrowings that are attributable to the acquisition, construction, or improvement of those assets less than any unspent debt proceeds.

*Restricted net position* - Consists of net position with constraints placed on its use either by 1) external groups such as creditors, grantors, contributors, or laws or regulations of other governments or, 2) law through constitutional provisions or enabling legislation.

*Unrestricted net position -* All other net position that does not meet the definition of "restricted" or "net investment in capital assets."

When both restricted and unrestricted resources are available for use, it is the District's policy to use restricted resources first and then unrestricted resources.

Equity is classified as fund balance in the fund financial statements and displayed in five components:

*Nonspendable* - includes amounts not in spendable form, such as inventory, or amounts required to be maintained intact legally or contractually (principal endowment) (e.g. inventory, pre-paid items, permanent scholarships).

*Restricted* - includes amounts constrained for a specific purpose by external parties (e.g. Debt Service, Capital Projects, State and Federal Grant Funds).

Committed - includes amounts constrained for a specific purpose by a government using its highest level of decision making authority, the Board of Education. This formal action (a resolution) must occur prior to the end of the reporting period, but the amount of the commitment, which will be subject to the constraints, may be determined in the subsequent period. Any changes to the constraints imposed require the same formal action of the Board of Education board that originally created the commitment.

Assigned - includes general fund amounts constrained for a specific purpose by the Board of Education or by an official that has been delegated authority to assign amounts. The Board of Education has declared that authority to any other body or official to assign amounts for a specific purpose within the General Fund may assign amounts for a specific purpose. The Board of Education may also take official action to assign amounts. Additionally, all remaining positive spendable amounts in governmental funds, other than the General Fund, that are neither restricted nor committed are considered assigned. Assignments may take place after the end of the reporting period.

*Unassigned* - includes residual positive fund balance within the General Fund which has not been classified within the other above mentioned categories. Unassigned fund balance may also include negative balances for any governmental fund if expenditures exceed amounts restricted, committed or assigned for those specific purposes.

In circumstances where an expenditure is to be made for a purpose for which amounts are available in multiple fund balance classifications, the order in which resources will be expended is as follows: restricted fund balance, followed by committed fund balance, assigned fund balance, and lastly, unassigned fund balance.

Governmental fund balances reported on the fund financial statements at June 30, 2017 are as follows:

The nonspendable fund balance in the General Fund is comprised of \$71,494 for inventory. The remaining restricted fund balances are for the purpose of the respective funds as described above in the Major Governmental Funds section. The committed and assigned fund balances, if any, are for the purpose of the respective fund as described above in the Major Governmental Funds section.

# Comparative Data

The financial statements include summarized prior-year comparative information. Such information does not include sufficient detail to constitute a presentation in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. Accordingly, such information should be read in conjunction with the District's financial statements for the year ended June 30, 2016, from which such summarized information was derived.

#### Eliminations and Reclassifications

In the process of aggregating data for the government-wide financial statements, some amounts reported as interfund activity and balances were eliminated or reclassified.

# NOTE 2 - STEWARDSHIP, COMPLIANCE AND ACCOUNTABILITY

# **Excess of Expenditures over Budget**

For the year ended June 30, 2017, expenditures exceeded budget in the General Fund, Transportation Fund, Municipal Retirement/Social Security Fund, Debt Service Fund and Capital Projects Fund by \$2,783,757, \$664,501, \$32,102, \$471,168, and \$1,405,339, respectively. These excesses were funded by available fund balances or bond proceeds.

*Interest Rate Risk.* Interest rate risk is the risk that changes in interest rates will adversely affect the value of an investment. The District's investment policy does not limit the District's investment portfolio to specific maturities.

*Credit Risk.* Credit risk is the risk that an issuer or other counterparty to an investment will not fulfill its obligations. State Statutes limit the investments in commercial paper and corporate bonds to the top three ratings of two nationally recognized statistical rating organizations (NRSRO's). The District is also authorized to invest in ISDLAF and the Illinois Funds. The District restricted its investments to only investments listed above.

The Illinois School District Liquid Asset Fund Plus (ISDLAF+) is a not-for-profit investment trust formed pursuant to the Illinois Municipal Code and managed by a Board of Trustees elected from participating members. The trust is not registered with the SEC as an investment company. Investments are rated AAAm and are valued at share price, which is the price for which the investment could be sold.

Concentration of Credit Risk. Concentration of credit risk is the risk of loss attributed to the magnitude of a government's investment in a single issuer. The District's investment policy does not restrict the amount of investment in any one issuer. The ISDLAF is not subject to concentration of credit risk.

Custodial Credit Risk - Deposits. With respect to deposits, custodial credit risk refers to the risk that, in the event of a bank failure, the District's deposits may not be returned to it. The District's investment policy limits the exposure to deposit custodial credit risk by requiring all deposits in excess of FDIC insurable limits to be secured by collateral in the event of default or failure of the financial institution holding the funds. As of June 30, 2017, the bank balance of the District's deposit with financial institutions totaled \$31,321,484; the entire amount was collateralized or insured.

Custodial Credit Risk - Investments. With respect to investments, custodial credit risk is the risk that, in the even of the failure of the counterparty, the government will not be able to recover the value of its investments or collateral securities that are in the possession of an outside party. The District's investment policy limits the exposure to investment custodial credit risk by requiring all investments be secured by private insurance or collateral.

Separate cash and investment accounts are not maintained for all District funds; instead, the individual funds maintain their invested and uninvested balances in the common checking and investment accounts, with accounting records being maintained to show the portion of the common account balance attributable to each participating fund.

# **NOTE 4 - INTERFUND TRANSFERS**

During the year, the Board transferred \$430,500 from the Operations and Maintenance Fund to the Debt Service Fund for Alternate Revenue Bonds principal and interest payments.

The District also made a transfer of \$304,429 from the Operations and Maintenance Fund to the Debt Service Fund for the capital lease principal and interest payment.

State law allows for the above transfers.

In prior years, the District defeased certain general obligation and other bonds by placing the proceeds of new bonds in an irrevocable trust to provide for all future debt service payments on the old bonds. Accordingly, the trust account assets and the liability for the defeased bonds are not included in the District's financial statements. At June 30, 2017, \$17,980,000 of bonds outstanding are considered defeased.

Interest maturities include \$40,929,273 of accreted interest on capital appreciation bonds, which is included as long-term debt on the statement of net position.

On November 7, 2006, the voters of the District approved a referendum providing for the issuance of \$450,000,000 in general obligation bonds for the purpose of building and equipping one new high school building, four new junior high school buildings, eight new elementary school buildings, an early childhood building, a maintenance building, a transportation facility, additions to existing school buildings, and alter, repair, equip, and provide technology improvements to existing buildings. Based on provisions specifically added for the District to the School Code of the State of Illinois Section 19-1, the bonds issued in the current year and future years related to this referendum are not subject to the District's legal debt limitation. Of the general obligation bonds outstanding at June 30, 2017, \$225,998,062 is not subject to the District's legal debt limitation.

The District is subject to the Illinois School Code, which limits the amount of certain indebtedness to 13.8% of the most recent available equalized assessed valuation of the District. As of June 30, 2017, the statutory debt limit for the District was \$246,821,979, providing a debt margin of \$144,221,880.

Capital Leases. The District has entered into a lease agreement as lessee for financing the acquisition of equipment. The lease agreement qualifies as a capital lease for accounting purposes and, therefore, the assets and obligations have been recorded at the present value of the future minimum lease payments as of the inception date. At June 30, 2017, \$1,144,499 of amounts included in capital assets were acquired via capital leases. The obligations for the capital leases will be repaid from the Debt Service Fund funded by transfers from the Operations and Maintenance Fund. # NOTE 9 - RISK MANAGEMENT

The District is exposed to various risks of loss related to theft of, damage to, and destruction of assets; errors and omissions; workers compensation; and natural disasters. To protect from such risks, the District participates in the following public entity risk pools: IASB Illinois School District Agency Property/Casualty Self-Insurance Pool. The day-to-day operations of the Pool are managed through a Board of Trustees, elected by member districts. The District pays annual premiums to the pools for insurance coverage. The arrangements with the pools provide that each will be self-sustaining through member premiums and will reinsure through commercial companies for claims in excess of certain levels established by the pools. There have been no significant reductions in insurance coverage from coverage in any of the past three fiscal years.

The District is a member of the IASB Endorsed Workers' Compensation Self-Insurance Trust, which has been formed to reduce local school districts' workers' compensation costs. The day-to-day operations of the Trust are managed through a Board of Trustees, elected by the member districts. Each member district has a financial responsibility for the annual membership contributions which are calculated to provide for the administrative expenses, specific and aggregate excess insurance coverage, and the funding of anticipated losses and loss adjustment expenses which will be borne directly by the membership.

The District is self-insured for medical, dental, and vision coverage that is provided to District personnel. A third party administrator administers claims for a monthly fee per participant. Expenditures are recorded as incurred in the form of direct contributions from the District to the third party administrator for payment of employee health claims and administration fees. The District's liability will not exceed \$200,000 per employee, as provided by stop-loss provisions incorporated in the plan. All claim handling procedures are performed by an independent claims administrator.

At June 30, 2017, total unpaid claims, including an estimate of claims that have been incurred but not reported to the administrative agent, totaled \$3,251,557. The claims payable amount of \$1,647,742 is recorded in the General Fund, while the incurred but not reported amount of \$1,603,815 is reported within long-term liabilities on the Statement of Net Position. The estimates are developed based on reports prepared by the administrative agent. The District does not allocate overhead costs or other nonincremental costs to the claims liability. For the two years ended June 30, 2016 and June 30, 2017, changes in the liability reported in the General Fund and long-term liabilities for unpaid claims are summarized as follows:

# **Teachers' Health Insurance Security**

The District participates in the Teacher Health Insurance Security (THIS) Fund, a cost-sharing, multiple-employer defined benefit post-employment healthcare plan that was established by the Illinois legislature for the benefit of retired Illinois public school teachers employed outside the city of Chicago. The THIS Fund provides medical, prescription, and behavioral health benefits, but it does not provide vision, dental, or life insurance benefits to annuitants of the Teachers' Retirement System (TRS). Annuitants not enrolled in Medicare may participate in the state-administered participating provider option plan or choose from several managed care options. Annuitants who are enrolled in Medicare Parts A and B may be eligible to enroll in a Medicare Advantage plan.

The State Employees Group Insurance Act of 1971 (5 ILCS 375) outlines the benefit provisions of the THIS Fund and amendments to the plan can be made only by legislative action with the Governor's approval. The plan is administered by the Illinois Department of Central Management Services (CMS) with the cooperation of TRS. Section 6.6 of the State Employees Group Insurance Act of 1971 requires all active contributors to TRS who are not employees of the state to make a contribution to the THIS Fund.

The percentage of employer required contributions in the future will not exceed 105 percent of the percentage of salary actually required to be paid in the previous fiscal year.

On Behalf Contributions to THIS Fund. The State of Illinois makes employer retiree health insurance contributions on behalf of the District. State contributions are intended to match contributions to THIS Fund from active members which were 1.12 percent of pay during the year ended June 30, 2017. State of Illinois contributions were \$1,119,735, and the District recognized revenues and expenditures of this amount during the year.

State contributions intended to match active member contributions during the years ended June 30, 2016 and June 30, 2015 were 1.07 and 1.02 percent of pay, respectively. For these years, state contributions on behalf of District employees were \$888,221 and \$763,982, respectively.

Employer Contributions to THIS Fund. The District also makes contributions to THIS Fund. The District's THIS Fund contribution was 0.84 percent during the year ended June 30, 2017 and 0.80 and 0.76 percent during the years ended June 30, 2016 and 2015, respectively. For the years ended June 30, 2017, 2016 and 2015 the District paid \$839,801, \$664,090 and \$569,242 to the THIS Fund, respectively, which was 100 percent of the required contribution for those years.

The publicly available financial report of the THIS Fund may be found on the website of the Illinois Auditor General: http://www.auditor.illinois.gov/Audit-Reports/ABC-List.asp. The current reports are listed under "Central Management Services." Prior reports are available under "Healthcare and Family Services."

#### Retirees' Health Plan

The District administers a single-employer defined benefit healthcare plan ("the Retirees' Health Plan"). The plan provides healthcare benefits for eligible retirees and their dependents through the District's group health insurance plan which covers both active and retired members. Benefit provisions are established through collective bargaining agreements and state that Illinois Municipal Retirement Fund (IMRF) retirees and their dependents are able to continue to participate in the health insurance plan at established contribution rates until the attainment of age 65. Also, three retired Superintendents are provided with life insurance coverage for their lifetimes. The Retirees' Health Plan does not issue a publicly available financial report.

Contribution requirements are established through collective bargaining agreements and may be amended only by the District Board. The required contribution is based on projected pay-as-you-go financing requirements. For fiscal year 2017, the District contributed no amounts to the plan. Plan members receiving benefits contribute 100 percent of their premium costs for a family plan and a single plan, respectively. For fiscal year 2017, total member contributions are \$50,112.

The District's annual other postemployment benefit (OPEB) cost (expense) is calculated based on the annual required contribution of the employer (ARC). The ARC represents a level of funding that, if paid on an ongoing basis, is projected to cover normal cost each year and amortize any unfunded actuarial liabilities (or funding excess) over a period not to exceed thirty years. The following table shows the components of the District's annual OPEB cost for the year, the amount actually contributed to the Retirees' Health Plan, and changes in the District's net OPEB obligation to the Retirees' Health Plan:

Amounts reported in 2017 reflect an investment rate of return of 4.0 percent, salary increases of 4.0 percent, and cost trend rate of 5.0 percent. Actuarial study is based on a entry age normal actuarial cost method with an amortization period of 30 years.

Projections of benefits for financial reporting purposes are based on the substantive plan (the plan is understood by the employer and plan members) and include the type of benefits provided at the time of each valuation and the historical pattern of sharing benefit costs between the employer and plan members to that point. The methods and assumptions used include techniques that are designed to reduce short-term volatility in actuarial accrued liabilities and the actuarial value of assets, consistent with the long-term perspective of the calculations.

#### NOTE 11 - RETIREMENT SYSTEMS

The retirement plans of the District include the Teachers' Retirement System of the State of Illinois (TRS) and the Illinois Municipal Retirement Fund (IMRF). Most funding for TRS is provided through payroll withholdings of certified employees and contributions made by the State of Illinois on-behalf of the District. IMRF is funded through property taxes and a perpetual lien of the District's corporate personal property replacement tax. Each retirement system is discussed below.

# **Teachers' Retirement System**

Plan Description. The District participates in the Teachers' Retirement System of the State of Illinois (TRS). TRS is a cost-sharing multiple-employer defined benefit pension plan that was created by the Illinois legislature for the benefit of Illinois public school teachers employed outside the city of Chicago. TRS members include all active nonannuitants who are employed by a TRS-covered employer to provide services for which teacher licensure is required. The Illinois Pension Code outlines the benefit provisions of TRS, and amendments to the plan can be made only by legislative action with the Governor's approval. The TRS Board of Trustees is responsible for the System's administration.

TRS issues a publicly available financial report that can be obtained at http://trsil.org/pubs/cafr.htm; by writing to TRS at 2815 W. Washington, PO Box 19253, Springfield, IL 62794; or by calling (888) 678-3675, option 2.

Benefits Provided. TRS provides retirement, disability, and death benefits. *Tier I* members have TRS or reciprocal system service prior to January 1, 2011. *Tier I* members qualify for retirement benefits at age 62 with five years of service, at age 60 with 10 years, or age 55 with 20 years. The benefit is determined by the average of the four highest years of creditable earnings within the last 10 years of creditable service and the percentage of average salary to which the member is entitled. Most members retire under a formula that provides 2.2 percent of final average salary up to a maximum of 75 percent with 34 years of service. Disability and death benefits are also provided.

*Tier II* members qualify for retirement benefits at age 67 with 10 years of service, or a discounted annuity can be paid at age 62 with 10 years of service. Creditable earnings for retirement purposes are capped and the final average salary is based on the highest consecutive eight years of creditable service rather than the last four. Disability provisions for *Tier II* are identical to those of *Tier I*. Death benefits are payable under a formula that is different from *Tier 1*.

Essentially all *Tier I* retirees receive an annual 3 percent increase in the current retirement benefit beginning January 1 following the attainment of age 61 or on January 1 following the member's first anniversary in retirement, whichever is later. *Tier II* annual increases will be the lesser of three percent of the original benefit or one-half percent of the rate of inflation beginning January 1 following attainment of age 67 or on January 1 following the member's first anniversary in retirement, whichever is later.

Contributions. The State of Illinois maintains the primary responsibility for funding TRS. The Illinois Pension Code, as amended by Public Act 88-0593 and subsequent acts, provides that for years 2010 through 2045, the minimum contribution to the System for each fiscal year shall be an amount determined to be sufficient to bring the total assets of the System up to 90 percent of the total actuarial liabilities of the System by the end of fiscal year 2045.

Contributions from active members and TRS contributing employers are also required by the Illinois Pension Code. The contribution rates are specified in the pension code. The active member contribution rate for the year ended June 30, 2016 was 9.4 percent of creditable earnings. On July 1, 2016 the rate dropped to 9.0 percent of pay due to the expiration of the Early Retirement Option (ERO). The member contribution, which may be paid on behalf of employees by the District, is submitted to TRS by the District.

On Behalf Contributions to TRS. The State of Illinois makes employer pension contributions on behalf of the District. For the year ended June 30, 2017, State of Illinois contributions recognized by the District were based on the state's proportionate share of the collective net pension liability associated with the District, and the District recognized revenue and expenditures of \$48,926,820 in pension contributions from the State of Illinois.

2.2 Formula Contributions. Employers contribute 0.58 percent of total creditable earnings for the 2.2 formula change. The contribution rate is specified by statute. Contributions for the year ended June 30, 2017, were \$1,261,283, and are deferred because they were paid after the June 30, 2016 measurement date.

Federal and Trust Fund Contributions. When TRS members are paid from federal and special trust funds administered by the District, there is a statutory requirement for the District to pay an employer pension contribution from those funds. Under a policy adopted by the TRS Board of Trustees that has been in effect since the fiscal year ended June 30, 2006, employer contributions for employees paid from federal and special trust funds will be the same as the state contribution rate to TRS. Public Act 98-0674 now requires the two rates to be the same.

For the year ended June 30, 2017, the District pension contribution was 38.54 percent of salaries paid from federal and special trust funds. Contributions for the year ended June 30, 2017, were \$150,768, which was equal to the District's required contribution. These contributions are deferred because they were paid after the June 30, 2016 measurement date.

TRS Fiduciary Net Position. Detailed information about the TRS's fiduciary net position as of June 30, 2016 is available in the separately issued TRS Comprehensive Annual Financial Report.

*Net Pension Liability.* At June 30, 2017, the District reported a liability for its proportionate share of the net pension liability (first amount shown below) that reflected a reduction for state pension support provided to the District. The state's support and total are for disclosure purposes only. The amount recognized by the District as its proportionate share of the net pension liability, the related state support, and the total portion of the net pension liability that was associated with the District were as follows:

The net pension liability was measured as of June 30, 2016, and the total pension liability used to calculate the net pension liability was determined by an actuarial valuation as of June 30, 2015, and rolled forward to June 30, 2016. The District's proportion of the net pension liability was based on the District's share of contributions to TRS for the measurement year ended June 30, 2016, relative to the projected contributions of all participating TRS employers and the state during that period. At June 30, 2016 and 2015, the District's proportion was 0.01452145 percent and 0.01370221 percent, respectively.

Summary of Significant Accounting Policies. For purposes of measuring the collective net pension liability, deferred outflows of resources and deferred inflows of resources related to pensions, and pension expense, information about the fiduciary net position of TRS and additions to/deductions from TRS fiduciary net position have been determined on the same basis as they are reported by TRS. For this purpose, benefit payments (including refunds of employee contributions) are recognized when due and payable in accordance with the benefit terms. Investments are reported at fair value.

Actuarial Assumptions. The assumptions used to measure the total pension liability in the June 30, 2016 actuarial valuation included (a) 7.00% investment rate of return net of pension plan investment expense, including inflation, (b) projected salary increases varies by amount of service credit, and (c) inflation of 2.50%.

For the June 30, 2016 valuation, the investment return assumption was lowered from 7.50 percent to 7.00 percent. Salary increase assumptions were lowered from their 2015 levels. Other assumptions were based on the 2015 experience analysis which increased retirement rates, improved mortality assumptions and made other changes.

*Mortality.* Mortality rates were based on the RP-2014 White Collar Table with adjustments as appropriate for TRS experience. The rates are used on a fully-generational basis using projection table MP-2014.

Long-Term Expected Real Rate of Return. The long-term expected rate of return on pension plan investments was determined using a building-block method in which best-estimate ranges of expected future real rates of return (expected returns, net of pension plan investment expense and inflation) are developed for each major asset class. These ranges are combined to produce the long-term expected rate of return by weighting the expected future real rates of return by the target asset allocation percentage and by adding expected inflation. The target allocation and best estimates of arithmetic real rates of return for each major asset class that were used by the actuary are summarized in the following table:

Discount Rate. At June 30, 2016, the discount rate used to measure the total pension liability was a blended rate of 6.83 percent, which was a change from the June 30, 2015 rate of 7.47 percent. The projection of cash flows used to determine the discount rate assumed that employee contributions, employer contributions, and state contributions will be made at the current statutorily-required rates.

Based on those assumptions, TRS's fiduciary net position at June 30, 2016 was not projected to be available to make all projected future benefit payments of current active and inactive members and all benefit recipients. Tier I's liability is partially funded by Tier II members, as the Tier II member contribution is higher than the cost of Tier II benefits. Due to this subsidy, contributions from future members in excess of the service cost are also included in the determination of the discount rate. Despite the subsidy, all projected future payments were not covered, so a slightly lower long-term expected rate of return on TRS investments was applied to all periods of projected benefit payments to determine the total pension liability.

At June 30, 2015, the discount rate used to measure the total pension liability was 7.47 percent. The discount rate was lower than the actuarially-assumed rate of return on investments that year as well because TRS's fiduciary net position and the subsidy provided by Tier II were not sufficient to cover all projected benefit payments.

Discount Rate Sensitivity. The following presents the District's proportionate share of the net pension liability calculated using the discount rate of 6.83 percent, as well as what the District's proportionate share of the net pension liability would be if it were calculated using a discount rate that is 1-percentage-point lower (5.83 percent) or 1-percentage-point higher (7.83 percent) than the current rate:

#### Illinois Municipal Retirement Fund

Plan Description. The District's defined benefit pension plan for Regular employees provides retirement and disability benefits, post retirement increases, and death benefits to plan members and beneficiaries. The District's plan is managed by the Illinois Municipal Retirement Fund (IMRF), the administrator of a multi-employer pension plan. Benefit provisions are established by statute and may only be changed by the General Assembly of the State of Illinois. IMRF issues a publicly available financial report that includes financial statements and required supplementary information. The report may be obtained on-line at www.imrf.org.

All employees hired in positions that meet or exceed the prescribed annual hourly standard must be enrolled in IMRF as participating members. Public Act 96-0889 created a second tier for IMRF's Regular Plan. IMRF assigns a benefit tier to a member when he or she is enrolled in IMRF. The tier is determined by the member's first IMRF participation date. If the member first participated in IMRF before January 1, 2011, they participate in *Regular Tier 1*. If the member first participated in IMRF on or after January 1, 2011, they participate in *Regular Tier 2*.

For *Regular Tier 1*, pension benefits vest after eight years of service. Participating members who retire at or after age 60 with 8 years of service are entitled to an annual retirement benefit, payable monthly for life, in an amount equal to 1-2/3% of the final rate of earnings for the first 15 years of service credit, plus 2% for each year of service credit after 15 years to a maximum of 75% of their final rate of earnings. Final rate of earnings is the highest total earnings during any consecutive 48 months within the last 10 years of service, divided by 48. Under *Regular Tier 1*, the pension is increased by 3% of the original amount on January 1 every year after retirement. For *Regular Tier 2*, pension benefits vest after ten years of service. Participating members who retire at or after age 67 with 10 years of service are entitled to an annual retirement benefit, payable monthly for life, in an amount equal to 1-2/3% of the final rate of earnings for the first 15 years of service credit, plus 2% for each year of service credit after 15 years to a maximum of 75% of their final rate of earnings. Final rate of earnings is the highest total earnings during any 96 consecutive months within the last 10 years of service, divided by 96. Under *Regular Tier 2*, the pension is increased on January 1 every year after retirement, upon reaching age 67, by the *lesser* of 3% of the original pension amount, or 1/2 of the increase in the Consumer Price Index of the original pension amount. IMRF also provides death and disability benefits. These benefit provisions and all other requirements are established by state statute.

Contributions. As set by statute, District employees participating in IMRF are required to contribute 4.50 percent of their annual covered salary. The statute requires the District to contribute the amount necessary, in addition to member contributions, to finance the retirement coverage of its own employees. The District's actuarially determined contribution rate for calendar year 2016 was 9.32 percent of annual covered payroll. The District also contributes for disability benefits, death benefits and supplemental retirement benefits, all of which are pooled at the IMRF level. Contribution rates for disability and death benefits are set by the IMRF Board of Trustees, while the supplemental retirement benefits rate is set by statute.

Net Pension Liability/(Asset). The net pension liability/(asset) was measured as of December 31, 2016, and the total pension liability used to calculate the net pension liability/(asset) was determined by an annual actuarial valuation as of that date.

Summary of Significant Accounting Policies. For purposes of measuring the net pension liability/(asset), deferred outflows of resources and deferred inflows of resources related to pensions, and pension expense, information about the fiduciary net position of IMRF and additions to/deductions from IMRF fiduciary net position have been determined on the same basis as they are reported by IMRF. For this purpose, benefit payments (including refunds of employee contributions) are recognized when due and payable in accordance with the benefit terms. Investments are reported at fair value.

Actuarial Assumptions. The assumptions used to measure the total pension liability in the December 31, 2016 annual actuarial valuation included (a) 7.50% investment rate of return, (b) projected salary increases from 3.75% to 14.50%, including inflation, and (c) price inflation of 2.75%. The retirement age is based on experience-based table of rates that are specific to the type of eligibility condition. The tables were last updated for the 2014 valuation pursuant to an experience study of the period 2011-2013.

Mortality. For non-disabled retirees, an IMRF specific mortality table was used with fully generational projection scale MP-2014 (base year 2014). The IMRF specific rates were developed from the RP-2014 Blue Collar Health Annuitant Mortality Table with adjustments to match current IMRF experience. For disabled retirees, an IMRF specific mortality table was used with fully generational projection scale MP-2014 (base year 2012). The IMRF specific rates were developed from the RP-2014 Disabled Retirees Mortality Table applying the same adjustment that were applied for non-disabled lives. For active members, an IMRF specific mortality table was used with fully generational projection scale MP-2014 (base year 2012). The IMRF specific rates were developed from the RP-2014 Employee Mortality Table with adjustments to match current IMRF experience.

Long-Term Expected Real Rate of Return. The long-term expected rate of return on pension plan investments was determined using a building-block method in which best-estimate ranges of expected future real rates of return (expected returns, net of pension plan investment expense, and inflation) are developed for each major asset class. These ranges are combined to produce the long-term expected rate of return by weighting the expected future real rates of return to the target asset allocation percentage and adding expected inflation. The target allocation and best estimates of arithmetic and geometric real rates of return for each major asset class are summarized in the following table:

### NOTE 11 - RETIREMENT SYSTEMS - (CONTINUED)

Discount Rate. The discount rate used to measure the total pension liability for IMRF was 7.50%. The discount rate calculated using the December 31, 2015 measurement date was 7.48%. The projection of cash flows used to determine the discount rate assumed that member contributions will be made at the current contribution rate and that District contributions will be made at rates equal to the difference between actuarially determined contribution rates and the member rate. Based on those assumptions, the fiduciary net position was projected to be available to make all projected future benefit payments of current plan members. Therefore, the long-term expected rate of return on pension plan investments was applied to all periods of projected benefits payments to determine the total pension liability.

Discount Rate Sensitivity. The following is a sensitivity analysis of the net pension liability/(asset) to changes in the discount rate. The table below presents the pension liability of the District calculated using the discount rate of 7.50% as well as what the net pension liability/(asset) would be if it were to be calculated using a discount rate that is 1 percentage point lower (6.50%) or 1 percentage point higher (8.50%) than the current rate:

#### **NOTE 12 - CONTINGENT LIABILITIES**

The District is a defendant in various lawsuits. Although the outcome of these lawsuits is not presently determinable, in the opinion of the District's attorneys, the resolution of these matters will not have a material adverse effect on the financial condition of the District.

#### NOTE 13 - STATE AND FEDERAL AID CONTINGENCIES

The District has received federal and state grants for specific purposes that are subject to review and audit by the grantor agencies. Such audits could lead to requests for reimbursements to the grantor agency for expenditures disallowed under the terms of the grants. Management believes such disallowance, if any, would be immaterial.

#### **NOTE 14 - SUBSEQUENT EVENTS**

On September 13, 2017, the District issued \$16,720,000 of General Obligation Refunding Bonds with interest rates ranging from 3% to 5% to currently refund \$18,515,000 of the District's outstanding General Obligation Refunding Bonds, Series 2007A. The purpose of the refunding is to restructure the debt service payments of the District. The redemption date for the Series 2007A bonds is October 18, 2017.

NOTES TO REQUIRED SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION AS OF AND FOR THE YEAR ENDED JUNE 30, 2017

### STEWARDSHIP, COMPLIANCE AND ACCOUNTABILITY

#### **Budgetary Data**

Except for the exclusion of on-behalf payments from other governments, discussed below, the budgeted amounts for the Governmental Funds are adopted on the modified accrual basis, which is consistent with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

The Board of Education follows these procedures in establishing the budgetary data reflected in the general purpose financial statements:

- 1. The Administration submits to the Board of Education a proposed operating budget for the fiscal year commencing July 1. The operating budget includes proposed expenditures and the means of financing them.
- 2. Public hearings are conducted and the proposed budget is available for inspection to obtain taxpayer comments.
- 3. Prior to September 30, the budget is legally adopted through passage of a resolution. By the last Tuesday in December, a tax levy resolution is filed with the county clerk to obtain tax revenues.
- 4. Management is authorized to transfer budget amounts, provided funds are transferred between the same function and object codes. The Board of Education is authorized to transfer up to a legal level of 10% of the total budget between functions within any fund; however, any revisions that alter the total expenditures of any fund must be approved by the Board of Education, after following the public hearing process mandated by law.
- 5. Formal budgetary integration is employed as a management control device during the year for all governmental funds.
- 6. All budget appropriations lapse at the end of the fiscal year.

The budget amounts shown in the financial statements are as originally adopted because there were no amendments during the past fiscal year.

#### **Budget Reconciliations**

The Statement of Revenues, Expenditures and Changes in Fund Balance - Governmental Funds (GAAP basis) includes "on-behalf" payments received and made for the amounts contributed by the State of Illinois for the employer's share of the Teachers Retirement System pension. The District does not budget for these amounts in the Educational Accounts of the General Fund. The differences between the budget and GAAP basis are as follows:

### **Excess of Expenditures over Budget**

For the year ended June 30, 2017, expenditures exceeded budget in the General Fund, Transportation Fund and the Municipal Retirement/Social Security Fund by \$2,783,757, \$664,501, and \$32,102, respectively. These excesses were funded by available fund balances.

### **Audit Report**

This Audit Report encompasses an evaluation of the accountability of program revenues, expenditures, fiscal internal controls and programmatic compliance for the following programs:

- General State Aid
- Special Education Personnel
- Special Education Orphanage
- Transportation Regular and Vocational
- Transportation Special Education
- Early Childhood Block Grant

General State Aid (GSA) is provided to school districts in order to provide unrestricted funding to supplement funding for Elementary and Secondary Education. School Districts access this funding by filing an annual claim with the Illinois State Board of Education. The claim is based upon a number of factors including the Equalized Assessed Valuation in the district, the amount of Available Local Resources and Average Daily Attendance of the students in the district.

# FSM Objective for Testing General State Aid:

The objective of our audit of the GSA Claim is to test on a sample basis to determine that the claim was completed in compliance with approved rules. As part of the testing process we determine that the district has maintained adequate documentation to support the claim that was filed, with emphasis on the data to support the Average Daily Attendance reported in the claim.

<u>Finding #1</u> The school district's summary for attendance computation was incorrect. The school district did not account for claimable early childhood students who met the requirements to be claimed for the 2013-2014 school year. Auditor also adjusted for a clerical error that affected the best three months. Auditor reviewed calendars for kindergarten and early childhood and made the proper adjustments. The effects to the claim are as follows:

The Special Education Personnel Reimbursement is intended to provide funding for school districts and special education cooperatives employing the necessary staff to serve children and youth with disabilities, ages 3 to 21 years old. Staff that is employed for these specialized purposes includes teachers, social workers, nurses, psychologists, counselors, physical and occupational therapists, individual or classroom aides, readers, administrators, and other staff assigned to work in the area of special education. The State reimburses local school districts and special education cooperatives \$9,000 per certified staff and \$3,500 for non-certified staff employed on a full time basis for the school year, depending on the final reimbursement level. The school districts and special education cooperatives access this funding by filing an annual claim with the Illinois State Board of Education.

FSM Objective for Testing Special Education Personnel Reimbursement Claim:

The objective of our audit of the Special Education Personnel Claim is to test on a sample basis to determine that the claim was completed in compliance with approved rules. As part of the testing process we determine that the district has maintained supporting documentation to support the claim that was filed, with emphasis on the salaries paid, the full time equivalents (FTE's) of the staff and amount of off-setting federal funds received.

<u>Finding #1</u> The LEA did not report the amount of Federal funds used for salaries of personnel claimed for Special Education Personnel Reimbursement correctly. The LEA did not account for federal funds received for special education salaries from the Federal Special Education – I.D.E.A – Flow Through (4620-00) grant for the 2013-2014 school year.

<u>Recommended Corrective Action</u> The LEA must report the amount of Federal funds used for salaries of personnel claimed for Special Education Personnel Reimbursement correctly.

<u>Finding #1</u> The LEA overstated allowable expenditures on the Special Education Tuition Cost Sheet. Documentation for special education cost sheets for students in district programs did not sufficiently account for all information claimed for the 2013-2014 school year. Auditor allowed expenditures for which documentation was sufficient and reduced the education cost to the per capita for students in which documentation was insufficient.

Recommended Corrective Action The LEA must claim only allowable expenditures on the Special Education Tuition Cost Sheet.

The transportation funding is to provide reimbursement to local education agencies that transport students who reside 1.5 miles or more from their attendance center, reside less than 1.5 miles with an approved safety hazard as determined by the Illinois Department of Transportation, attend a vocational program and are transported by their resident district during the school day or transport students with disabilities who have transportation needs. School Districts access this funding by filing an annual claim with the Illinois State Board of Education.

FSM Objective for Testing Student Transportation Claim:

The objective of our audit of the Student Transportation Claim is to test on a sample basis to determine that the claim was completed in compliance with approved rules. As part of the testing process we determine that the district has maintained supporting documentation to support the claim that was filed including but not limited to reporting allowable expenditures and are using the correct allocation methods for claimable expenditures.

<u>Finding #1</u> The LEA did not allocate expenditures based upon the required allocation method. The district failed to allocate district expenses (salaries, benefits, purchased services and supplies) based on the ratio of miles traveled by district-owned vehicles only. In addition, contractual transportation expenses were not properly allocated based on vendor specific mileage.

<u>Recommended Corrective Action</u> The LEA must allocate expenditures based upon the required allocation method.

<u>Finding #2</u> The LEA claimed non-reimbursable expenditures in categories other than non-reimbursable. The LEA reported expenses related to professional development/conferences, travel and food on line 14c – purchased services. In addition, office computers/equipment was reported on line 14f – supplies.

<u>Recommended Corrective Action</u> The LEA must not claim expenditures that are not claimable for transportation reimbursement in categories other than non-reimbursable.

<u>Finding #3</u> The LEA overstated Transportation Fund expenditures as reconciled with the Annual Financial Report. Expenses reported on line 14b – benefits were overstated.

Recommended Corrective Action The LEA must not overstate Transportation Fund expenditures as reconciled with the Annual Financial Report.

<u>Finding #4</u> The LEA understated Transportation Fund expenditures as reconciled with the Annual Financial Report. Expenses reported on line 14a – salaries were understated.

<u>Recommended Corrective Action</u> The LEA must not understate Transportation Fund expenditures as reconciled with the Annual Financial Report.

<u>Finding #5</u> The LEA did not claim depreciation expense correctly. Auditor noted that there was a net understatement of claimable depreciation expense. In addition, the principal cost on four newly leased buses (Sequences 531-534) was not properly reported.

Recommended Corrective Action The LEA must claim depreciation expense correctly.

<u>Finding #6</u> The LEA understated revenues as reconciled with the Annual Financial Report. The LEA failed to report revenue received from other districts, pupils/parents for transportation and field trip fees, federal grants (Title I) and the special education pupil orphanage claim.

<u>Recommended Corrective Action</u> The LEA must not understate revenues as reconciled with the Annual Financial Report.

The Early Childhood Block Grant (ECBG) supports two major programs, Preschool for All for children from 3 year olds to kindergarten enrollment age and Prevention Initiative for children birth to age three years. The Preschool for All (PFA) program provides at least 2.5 hours of high quality preschool, including comprehensive developmental screening, bachelors-level early childhood licensed teachers, and standards-aligned research-based curriculum. Prevention Initiative (PI) provides coordinated child development and family support services for at-risk infants and toddlers, including parent education and home visiting. The PFA and PI programs are intended for children who have been determined to be at risk for school failure as indicated by their families' high levels of poverty, illiteracy, unemployment, limited-English proficiency, or other need-related indicators.

#### FSM Objective for Testing Early Childhood Block Grant:

The objective of our fiscal review is to test on a sample basis that the funds are being used in accordance with the grant requirements. During this process we determine for our sample selected that the expenditures claimed were allowable, were approved in the budget submitted to Illinois State Board of Education Program Staff, expenditures were within the grant period, expenditures were supported by proper documentation and the expenditures were properly accounted for and recorded in the correct accounts.

**Finding #1** The grant recipient did not submit accurate periodic expenditure reports. Review of the general ledger and expenditure report submitted through June 30, 2015 on July 1 2015 revealed that the grant recipient overstated and understated expenditures as follows:
