This letter will serve as Community Unit School District 308's response to your February 8, 2017 request under the Freedom of Information Act (5 ILCS 140/1 et seq.), in which you asked for the above referenced information. The information responsive to your request is attached.

Please note that certain records are exempt from disclosure pursuant to Section 5 ILCS 140/6(m) of the Illinois Freedom of Information Act as they constitute communications between the public body and an attorney that would not be subject to discovery in litigation.

Dear Elected Officials and Representatives of the State of Illinois:

On behalf of Community Unit School District 308, which serves over 17,000 students in the communities of Aurora, Joliet, Montgomery, Oswego, Plainfield and Yorkville, Illinois, I would respectfully request your continued consideration for funding of the School Construction Grant Entitlement. I have attached our FY2004 application for construction grant funding for your reference, which shows approximately \$49 million in anticipated entitlements.

School District 308 is the ninth largest district in Illinois with most of its residents living in Kendall County. Kendall County experienced a 110% growth increase from 2000 to 2010 and was the fastest-growing county in the United States over the same time period. Because of this spike in population, student enrollment has almost doubled since applying for construction grant funds in 2002.



This exponential growth, combined with depreciation of property values, business closures, reduced state funding and unfunded state mandates has left a very heavy tax burden on an already encumbered community. The district has already seen a reduction of \$11 million dollars in general state aid over several years, and carries over \$675 million in debt, including principal and interest.

In the interest of maintaining transparent and responsible fiscal accountability, we are reaching out to elected officials in Springfield representing Community Unit School District 308 to urge you to fulfill the commitment of funding the FY2004 School Construction Grant Entitlement. I look forward to meeting with you to discuss ways this money can be distributed in an expeditious manner.

Dear Superintendent:

Thank you for your correspondence with regards to the status of the School Construction Grant Program and thank you for the opportunity to clarify when school districts are "entitled" to receive School Construction Grant Funds.

While we recognize the vast construction needs across Illinois, ISBE cannot promise funds or issue entitlements to a school district until we are given the release of funds from the Governor. School districts that submitted a School Construction application by October 2004 received a letter from ISBE acknowledging the receipt of the application. The letter stated that if funding for the program was extended by the General Assembly and further verification of the application indicated that the district was eligible for entitlement, the entitlement would be retroactive back to the receipt date of the application. The letter further states that, since authorization has not been approved to fund the program, it was inappropriate to take action towards issuing any additional entitlements. Therefore, the 2004 through the 2015 listing of school districts is merely an alphabetical listing of districts that have submitted an application. None of these districts have been entitled for a School Construction Grant award. After October 2004, no letters have been issued by ISBE acknowledging the receipt of the application or assuring that if they receive an entitlement, it will be retroactive back to the date of the application.

In accordance with 105 ILCS 230/5-37, only school districts that have been issued a grant entitlement for a school construction project and have arranged and approved all local financing but did not receive a grant award due to lack of adequate appropriations shall be placed ahead of any new school construction project. Since the districts that are on the 2004 through 2015 application listings have not been entitled, they are not guaranteed funding for their project. A State liability is not incurred until a formal entitlement letter is issued. An entitlement letter has not been issued for the districts on the 2004 through 2015 applicant listings.

I would also like to point out that the Illinois State Board of Education approved as part of its FY 2015 Budget request a \$450 million capital funds request for school technology infrastructure. The request approved by the Board at the January 2014 meeting does not include utilizing any remaining bond proceeds, but rather is being proposed a new, separate capital funds request.

This letter is intended to remind school districts that are on the 2004 through 2015 school construction alphabetical, application listings that they have not been entitled for School Construction Grant awards. These listings are merely an alphabetical listing of school districts that have submitted an application for potential future School Construction funds. No guarantee of funding has been issued for these districts.
