Top of Mind: Budgeting for SEL

If you're wondering about district or state priorities, one should take a close look at their budgets - and this budget season is no exception. There is a fresh urgency and unprecedented opportunity to invest in SEL, including support for students' learning and development, educator well-being, family and community partnerships, and more inclusive and equitable learning environments. The historic levels of K-12 dollars through the [American Rescue Plan](#) can provide a long-term foundation for evidence-based, systemic implementation of SEL as we move beyond the pandemic.

We strongly recommend engaging students, educators, families, and communities in the planning and decision-making process around investments to holistically support all students and adults. Here are seven potential SEL investments to discuss:

Potential SEL Investments

- Expanded learning opportunities
- Evidence-based SEL programs
- Staffing and schedules
- Support for adult well-being
- Professional learning
- Integrated support systems
- Data systems

1. Expanded learning opportunities that integrate social, emotional, and academic learning across in-school and [out-of-school time](#)
2. [Evidence-based SEL programs](#) that emphasize developmentally appropriate and culturally affirming SEL competencies
3. Staffing and schedules that support [relationship-centered](#) practices
4. Support for educator, school staff, and out-of-school time provider [well-being](#)
5. Professional learning that builds [educator capacity](#) to promote SEL and create safe, inclusive learning environments for all students
6. Integrated support systems across schools, families, and [communities](#)
7. Data systems that inform students, educators, and families and support continuous improvement of student outcomes and experiences

With these considerations and resources in mind, this moment offers not only a challenge to meet, but also an opportunity to rebuild our education system to better support every student.

SEL and Program Selection: Aligning to District Priorities

As districts work to bring SEL to life, the selection of the right programs is critical. So how do you adopt an evidence-based SEL program that is aligned with district priorities, is culturally relevant, and feels like a seamless part of core instruction? That question was raised in El Paso Independent School District (EPISD), which serves over 57,000 PreK-12th grade students in Texas. Our new [Practices of Promise](#) series features their story and offers key takeaways, including the importance of meaningfully engaging staff, families, and the whole community. To select SEL programs, the El Paso team worked with a wide range of stakeholders to align with existing initiatives, engaged parents and community members in the decision-making process, and listened to teachers and school leaders about implementation needs. Their example reminds us to consider how programs can support the strengths, cultural backgrounds, and interests of the community, and to ensure the selected programs are supported throughout the district and meet community needs.

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SEL and Discipline: Developing Equity-Centered Practices

When discipline policies and practices are centered around student learning, developmentally appropriate, and culturally responsive, they can reinforce SEL and support equitable outcomes. Many school districts are moving away from the ineffective strategies of punishment and external control that have been historically used for misbehavior. But study after study has [shown](#) that when accounting for a range of student, family, and school level contributors, African American students still receive significantly more exclusionary discipline than white students. To challenge disparities, a [new research paper](#) suggests that education leaders need to combine SEL and discipline efforts with a deeper understanding of cultural and historical oppression, capacity-building for adults' cultural competence, strengths-based supports, and instructional approaches that address opportunity gaps.

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SEL and Civics: Using Service-Learning to Reach Beyond the Classroom

Parents and teachers agree that SEL and service-learning have a reciprocal, mutually reinforcing relationship. Service-learning offers students real-world experiences that connect classroom learning to life, broaden perspectives, deepen social awareness, and connect actions to the needs of communities. But there is an implementation gap: Only one in 10 teachers believe their schools are very successful at developing students' ability to apply knowledge to real-world situations and their SEL skills. To address this, we need to strengthen both [SEL and civic learning](#) opportunities in tandem. A [new report](#) argues for expanding student opportunities like service-learning electives, promoting SEL and service-learning training for staff, as well as embedding it into state standards and workforce prep models.

Educator Survey Highlights SEL Needs

New data from Houghton Mifflin Harcourt's
6th Annual Educator Report

This survey included more than 1,200 K-12 classroom teachers and 200+ administrators. While only 17% believed their school was prepared for distance learning in the spring, a majority said they have learned and are using new online or virtual instructional methodologies.
